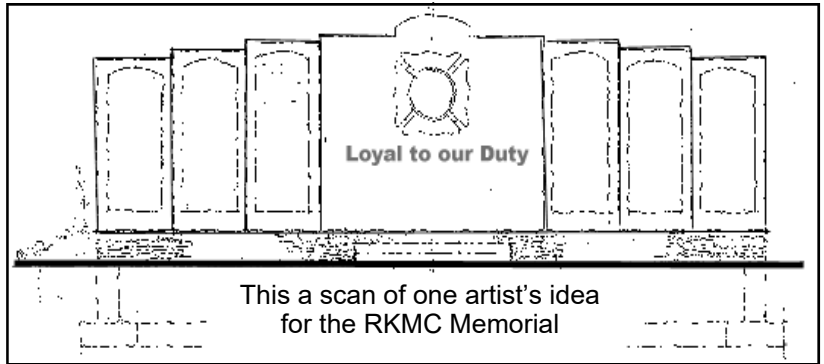

The Memorial - A Call for Design Ideas

Background: During the 2002 Rhode Island Red Knights convention Don Parker of Massachusetts Chapter 1 presented President Brouillet with a letter from the town of Boylston board of selectmen granting the Red Knights MC permission to build a monument on town property.



Since then MA1 has secured an approximately 1.4 acre parcel in front of the Boylston Town House and adjacent to the Boylston Fire Station. The goal is to have the monument ready by the 25th Anniversary Convention to be held in Massachusetts in 2007.

A preliminary plan on how the site might be laid out was submitted to us by Stewart Thurston. We hope this is the first of many for us to consider. This first plan was 18 feet deep and 34 feet wide, and had the classic look seen in many of the WWII monuments across the North American continent.

As it now stands we have several local firms that have offered to donate professional services and materials. Pine Ridge Design has offered to design a landscape plan around the final design and assist us in the plantings. Bigelow Nurseries has indicated they will donate some shrubs and plants.

Call for Design Ideas: The Monument Committee is requesting more input and design ideas from all chapters for the project. Please send, via postal mail or e-mail, your thoughts, comments, sketches, or layouts by October of 2005. The only firm design element is that you would need to have engraved bricks in the design. All designers need to be considerate of costs. The granite alone for that first preliminary plan priced out to \$50,000. The monument fund has just over \$7,000 in it today. So we need a modest design, or we need very aggressive fund raising by all the chapters over the next year.

Tsunami Relief Collection

Following the devastating tsunami in the Asian countries of the Indian Ocean, Newport News Chaplain Marie Boyd wanted to raise money for the American Red Cross Tsunami Disaster Fund. Her idea was to live like a refugee in a parking lot for one week and to collect as many donations as possible. She contacted the local IAFF Newport News Chapter 794 and then the local Red Knights Virginia Chapter 6 for assistance with the set-up and maintaining a shelter for the week.

Chapter 6 members spent many hours keeping the chaplain company around the clock and assisting with the collection of over \$21,000 in donations. All donations were slipped through a hole in the top of an over-pack drum provided by the Newport News Fire Department Regional Response Haz -Mat Team.

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Vest Patch & Rocker Issues for the Safety of all our Members.

Dear Members,

Changing the requirements for the bottom rockers of the vest patches has been done for only one reason, and that is for the safety of all our members.

We are no longer a small club with membership just in the northeast U.S. As we have grown into different areas other problems have arisen. Earlier in the club's history we had an issue with a 1% club. They had issues with us using Red & White as our colors. So the Red Knights added Red & Gold. **This change was voted and passed by the board for the safety of all our members.** It was also voted at that time to allow chapters the choice of using either color. By doing this we were able to work out the problem so that the other organization and we could comfortably coexist.

Over the years we have been very lucky to have Red Knight members who have developed relationships with members of the 1% clubs. By working through them we have been able to avert any problems before they got out of hand.

Last fall we got word from another 1% club that there was going to be a problem in several areas down south. The problem they stated was that we were using the state full name on the bottom rocker. After working through our contacts we were able to come to an agreement that the Red Knights would start using the state abbreviation on the vest rockers (Mass - Chapter 100). Once again the change was voted on by the whole board and passed. **This has been done for the safety of all our members.**

People ask why we should give in to them? Think about this. You are out on a nice ride with your wife and friends and someone gets hurt over what it says on your vest because the RKMC Leadership did not make the effort to fix a problem like this. Would you want that on your head?

As trained professionals we all should think about one thing - **The safety of all.** And that is why the Executive Board has made the decision to alter the design of the lower vest rockers.

Chapter Blanket Insurance Policy: The International has again purchased a blanket insurance policy to help chapters in defraying insurance expenses for their individual chapter sponsored events.

The International Executive board strongly suggests that any time your chapter sponsors or co-sponsors an event, that you purchase Liability Insurance to cover not only your chapter and its members but the facility where you are hosting your event.

To insure every participant coming to your ride, dance or fundraiser for up to \$1,000,000 of personal liability it will cost:

- 1-250 participants it costs the chapter \$130.00,
- 251-500 participants it cost the chapter \$160.00
- 501-1500 it costs the Chapter \$272.00
- 1501-3000 participants it costs the chapter \$338.00
- anything over 3000 will cost the chapter \$426.00.

From the Office of the Executive Secretary

Greetings Brothers and Sisters,

The Red Knights Motorcycle Club is growing in membership and chapters. Since the last convention we have had 56 requests for new chapter applications and have 23 new chapters to date. We now have 209 active chapters and have added one new State Association. The Regional Directors are working with the State/Province Representatives to set up these Associations. If your state or province needs more information on the formation of an Association, please contact your Regional Director.

The International Board is proud to announce a new program for the membership. At this year's convention we will award our first *International Red Knight of the Year*. This award will be known as the "**Perry Carter Award**," recognizing the late Perry Carter for his endless work and dedication to our club.

To be eligible for this award the recipient must be an active member in good standing with the International and their Chapter. This program includes Members at Large.

Each Chapter may nominate a member from its Chapter for the Perry Carter Award. The nomination would be sent to the State/Province Representative and then to the Regional Director. Each Regional Director will forward their nominees to the Eastern Regional Director who will serve as the Chairperson.

A Member at Large, a Chapter President, or an Executive Board member of the Red Knights International may nominate a Member at Large. This nomination would follow the same path as listed above.

Members who are nominated should have been present at 50% of their chapter events during the year. The member nominated should have visited at least one other Chapter during the year. The member nominated should have attended the International Convention in the past. The Member nominated should represent and signify the Red Knight's standard in their dealings with the public and the International's members.

The Regional Director shall forward a letter with their nomination outlining the member's qualities shown for this award to the Eastern Regional Director. The deadline for receiving the nomination shall be prior to June 1st of each year. The final decision will be made at Americade of each year. 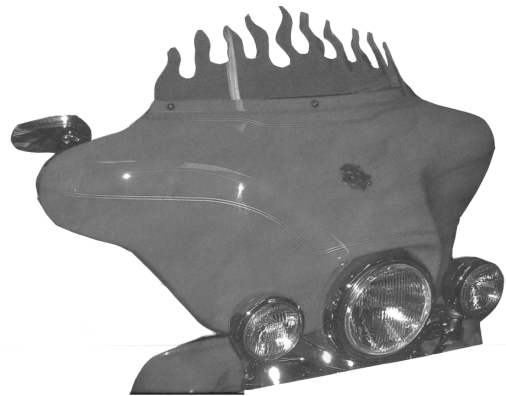

RED KNIGHTS Grand Tour

What is the Grand Tour?

When the club was young, the easiest way to tell others about it was by word of mouth. This meant that the members had to get out to visit other firefighters in their areas, and one of the best ways to do that was to visit Fire Stations. Someone came up with the idea of rewarding members who made a certain number of visits with a certificate and a pin. Proof of these visits was needed and so the idea of Grand Tour was born.

How do I earn a Grand Tour Pin

In order to earn a Grand Tour Pin you must first get an application form from the G.T. chairperson, then during the course of one (1) riding season you must visit nine (9) fire Stations whose names begin with the letters G R A N D T O U R, or twelve Fire Stations beginning with any letter of the alphabet (this is for members who live in some of the more remote areas and may not be able to come up with Stations beginning with the letters g r a n d t o u r). You must have a picture of you and your motorcycle taken at each Station, with the name sign visible. Co-riders may also earn a pin and a rider and co-

This appeared in a Rhode Island Newspaper in January

January 12 NARRAGANSETT, RHODE ISLAND - With temperatures dropping into the teens and a subzero wind chill, firefighters headed to a call at 73 Central St. at about 8:45 p.m. Monday. What they found was a Victorian house fully engulfed in flames and the possibility of someone inside. They quickly called for backup, including additional engines and off-duty firefighters.

A group of firefighters that included Lt. Joseph Conroy and firefighter Joel Hurst went to a front corner of the house. There, in a second-floor bathroom, they found a woman unconscious and severely burned. Less than a half hour after receiving the initial call, firefighters brought out the woman, believed to be 74-year-old Jeanne White. Fire Chief James Cotter confirmed White was taken to South County Hospital in Wakefield, then by medical helicopter to a Boston hospital.

"The rescue was the most important thing, we concentrated on getting that life out," said Cotter, who was in command of the fire.

New York Riders worked hard to protect the rights of all riders!

New York motorcyclists have a victory on tolls for motorcycles on the New York State Thruway. Beginning May 1, 2005 motorcycles will pay about half of what cars pay as long as the motorcyclist has an E-Z pass.

Right now, a car driver with or without an E-Z pass pays almost four cents a mile. Motorcyclists have been paying that same amount. Beginning in May motorcyclists with an E-Z pass will pay 1.9 cents per mile. To get an E-Z pass, motorcyclists can go to <http://capwiz.com/amacycle/utr/1/MJAXEGRFBX/LOAWEGRFHR/> for the application.

Other states who have the EZ Pass also have reciprocal agreements. For example, your Massachusetts EZ Pass will also work in New York.

You do not need to get additional insurance, but whether you are traveling on two wheels or by four, you need to visit your insurance agent and get a Canadian Insurance Card.

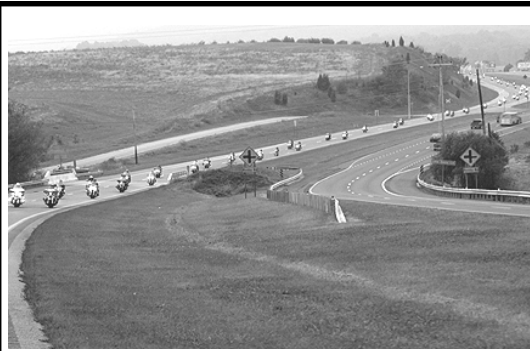

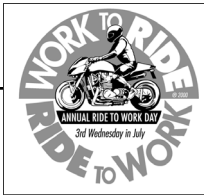

Returning to Virginia from Bike Week about a dozen years ago, I got into the Carolinas and noticed the temperature

Way back in the recesses of my brain, one not-yet-numb cell yelled out, "HYPOTHERMIA!"

Ride to Work Day reveals that motorcyclists come from all walks of life, work in all occupations, and range in age from teenagers to grandparents. The American Motorcyclist Association and many other worldwide rider organizations actively encourage all motorcyclists to ride their cycles to work as a grassroots demonstration on the third Wednesday in July each year.

Each work day more than eighty million cars and light trucks commute on American roads, but only about 200,000 individuals regularly ride their cycles to work.

After a bowl of chili and many cups of hot chocolate, I stuffed the Fayetteville Gazette between my jacket and chest and rode to the first available motel.

Three tubs of hot water later, life returned to normal, and I remained in the gene pool.

The lesson is simple: When the warning signs show up, heed them.

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The temperatures do not have to be excessively cold to cause hypothermia. Wind helps reduce the body temperature more quickly as does moisture — two conditions that we see while riding. Some of the warning signs of hypothermia include:

**Correct (and legible) mailing addresses** are very important when you submit chapter rosters to the International Treasurer each year. Some rosters are hand written and difficult to read. Others have missing information. The Fall 2004 newsletter that went out last December had over 300 addresses that were "undeliverable" because of misinformation or illegible information. To ensure that all our members receive their newsletter, please make sure that your mailing information is correct with your chapter — and chapter officers, please double check the addresses with your members before submitting the rosters to the International.
