Red Knights International Firefighters Memorial Site Report for 2008

As most members are aware we dedicated our Memorial Site in Boylston Massachusetts in August of 2007 this was a very proud moment for our organization in that we were able to dedicate this site to those that were members of the Red Knights when they passed away.

This site was built as a result of the vision and hard work put forth by the members of the Massachusetts chapter 1 with the support of the general membership and chapters.

Three members of the red knights that have gone beyond the norm in volunteering time and Labor to this cause and need to be recognized by the membership for their hard work and dedication to the memorial site are Don Parker, Peter Coskie and Roger Wentzell

The total cost for this project was \$128,152.94 this was done through donations of services and goods from various companies and members along with donations of \$22,141.85 from members and chapters. The International also advanced as an interest free loan the amount of \$23,108.00 to be paid back by continuous fund raising from the chapters. The balance still outstanding in balance of that loan is \$15,641.00 so we still have a long way to go to retire the loan amount.

On top of the loan repayment we need to have a funding project to ensure the continuous care and maintenance of the site. The International Quartermaster has for sale a Red Knights memorial patch which can be viewed on our web site in the quartermaster catalog all profits from the sale of this patch goes to the maintenance account for the memorial site.

For the 2008 year we had the set aside in the maintenance fund \$627.00 from the 2007 convention 50-50 draw as well as the \$725.00 raised by the raffling off at the 2007 convention of the beautiful hook rug made by Peggy Brouillet and her mother.

That \$1,52.00 along with \$6,500.00 that was put forth by the International allowed us to take care of this year's upkeep and the erection of an addition name plaque for the members that had passed on since the 2007 convention.

We currently have 116 members who have passed on and whose name is currently inscribed on the memorial plaques. This will be an ongoing process where every spring we will update the plaques with the names of those members that have passed on since the previous spring update.

To date this year we have only raised \$155.00 from the 2008 Convention 50-50 draw and \$690.00 from the sale of Heavens one-memorial patches for a total of \$2,860.62 a far cry from what is required to maintain the site.

So once again I am asking the chapters to make a donation to the Memorial. Below is a list of those chapters and individuals that have made pass donations, as you will note there are several that have made the donation to the site any annual gift. The recommended amount is a donation of \$100.00 for every member from the chapter that is on the memorial list, but again that is just a suggestion the chapters will have to decide what they can afford to donate some will be able to afford more and others less. All donations will help to keep this site as something we are all proud of and a show of respect for those of our members that are no longer with us.

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TRADEMARKS

The names **RED KNIGHTS, RED KNIGHTS MOTORCYCLE CLUB, REDKNIGHTS INTERNATIONAL FIREFIGHTERS MOTORCYCLE CLUB, RKMC AND OUR LOGO** are on file with the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office and the Canadian Intellectual Property Office as being licensed trademarks of the Red Knights International Firefighters Motorcycle Club.

This means that any item that displays the above shall have an approved trademark license agreement in place with the International Secretary before any item can be made, purchased or sold bearing our name(s) or logo.

Each item that uses our name(s) and/or logo shall have the ® showing that the name and/or logo has been approved and is registered.

Each chapter/association is required to obtain a trademark for chapter/association business items which will allow the use of our name/logo on web site, business cards, letterhead, checks, address labels, newsletters, flyers (to promote the chapter only), and chapter applications to conduct chapter business.

A trademark license agreement for merchandise will not be approved for a chapter or association that does not have an approved trademark license agreement in place for chapter/association business with the International Secretary.

The trademark license application can be found at www.redknightsmc.com under the link for merchandise.

If your chapter is not selling an item that it has a trademark license agreement for, please advise the International Secretary.

BY-LAWS

As of January 1, 2008, each chapter was instructed to resubmit their chapter by-laws for review and approval or to state that they were going to operate under the International By-Laws to Steve Chappell (by-law committee chairperson) at [by-laws@redknightsmc.com](mailto:bylaws@redknightsmc.com).

To date only 53 chapters have submitted their by-laws. This was not a suggestion and each chapter must submit their by-laws or advise that they are following the International By-Laws.

MATCHING FUND GRANTS

Chapters/Associations who are requesting matching fund grants will not be entitled to the funds if they do not have an approved chapter/association businesses trademark license agreement in place with the International Secretary.

NEW TOP ROCKER

The membership has approved a new top rocker that can be worn by Active members. Social and Associate members are not approved to wear this top rocker. The new top rocker will say "FIREFIGHTER".

MEMBER REQUIREMENTS

Section 5:04 of the International By-Laws states: Active membership shall be available to Active and Retired Firefighting personnel, whether they are Career, Part Paid, On Call, Volunteer, Military or Industrial and who presently own or have access to a Motorcycle and have a current legal Motorcycle endorsement. A past Active member who no longer can ride a motorcycle may retain their active status. Emergency Medical Technicians and Medics are eligible to be members if they are employees by an established Fire Department.

We are finding chapters who are not checking the qualifications of their members when joining the chapter. We advise all chapters to follow up on the qualifications of its members.

Re-selling of RKMC Items

The re-selling of RKMC items or giving them to a business that will re-sell them (like Goodwill) is not allowed under the RKMC Trademark and Constitution regulations.

If the person is no longer a member of the RKMC, they can return the items to the chapter, place it on a wall for their own display, or use the items for rags — but Red Knight items cannot be sold to the general public.

The following by-law changes are endorsed by the International Board

There are five proposed bylaws changes or additions. The changes/additions are in italics.

SECTION 1:04 A INSIGNIA PLACEMENT (change)

b. A top rocker showing membership status may be worn as listed in Section 2:01 of the By-Laws or another option available is a top rocker that reads "RED KNIGHTS" or "FIREFIGHTER"

SECTION 2:01 MEMBERSHIP CLASSIFICATION AND TENURE (NEW)

VI. An Active member can if they so wishes be a member of more than one chapter at a time. They must pay the same dues as other members of the chapter that they chooses to join and shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of an Active member in that chapter.

SECTION 5:06 SOCIAL MEMBERSHIP (change)

Social members shall be a Spouse, Partner, Boyfriend, Girlfriend, Son, Daughter, Brother or Sister of an Active Member, Associate Member or a Member-at-Large. *The minimum age for a social member shall be 16 years of age before joining.*

SECTION 5:07 SPECIAL HONORARY MEMBER (change)

Each Chartered Chapter may grant Special Honorary Membership status to a member of a recognized religion for the position of Chapter Chaplain. Special Honorary Membership may also be granted to a civic or business leader who does volunteer work for the Chapter. (REMOVE THIS LINE) *Special Honorary Membership may also be granted to the widow or widower of an Active or Associate Member.)*

(ADD THIS LINE) *The International dues for this membership classification is to be paid by the Chapter.*

SECTION 5:10 E-mail address of Record (NEW)

The Chapter mailing address and e-mail address of record will be that of the current Chapter President and Chapter Secretary. The Chapter Secretary shall maintain a current roster on file with the International. All communications from the International shall be forwarded to the proper Officer(s) or member. Communication to the International Executive Board shall be sent to the International Regional Director for distribution.

Chapter Business Trademark License

Any chapter who has a web page must now obtain a Chapter Business Trademark License.

The Chapter Business Trademark License is for use of our name/logo and will include use on a Chapter web site, business cards, letterhead, checks, address labels, newsletters, flyers (to promote your chapter only), and chapter application. Every Chapter who uses any of the listed items must apply for this license.

Use the Trademark License Application and under question 3 (What are you planning to produce) write "Chapter Business Trademark License."

If you are reading this in our newsletter it is obvious we are taking a different approach in the publication of our newsletter. Since the letter will be published on the web we have a great deal of flexibility, allowing us to publish more often and with greater impact on the club.

The release of the newsletters will be 1 April 2009, 1 July 2009, 1 October 2009, and 1 January 2010.

If you want your articles and photographs included in our newsletters I'll need them by the following dates:

For the April newsletter the deadline is 15 March, 2009.

For the July newsletter the deadline is 15 June, 2009.

For the October newsletter the deadline 15 September, 2009

For the January newsletter the deadline is 15 December, 2009

4 Mental & Physical Traps to Watch Out For on the Road... thought provoking tips from the AMA

Riding a bike keeps you in the elements, which is great, but it can also tire you out quickly. So always be on the lookout for:

Dehydration. Long days on the bike—or even short ones on hot days—can dry you out much faster than you realize. Either use a hydration system or take frequent breaks to drink fluids.

The Stupids. If you find your mind getting a bit foggy—say, you can't decide whether to stop for a break or not—take it for the warning sign that it is and stop. Are you hungry? Thirsty? Tired? Figure out what's wrong and fix it before you get back on the bike.

Small Pains that Could Turn Into Big Ones. Sitting in one position for long periods of time can cause muscle soreness. Tightening up? Stretch your muscles (safely) on the bike, or better yet, stop and walk around. A few minutes off the bike can buy you an hour or more of comfort back on it.

That Voice. If that voice in your head is telling you to stop for the night, or that another 100 miles may be too much before lunch, or that you're riding too fast, or anything else, do yourself a favor and listen.

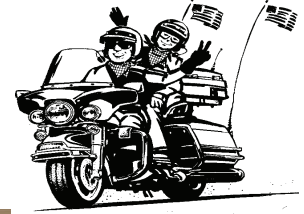
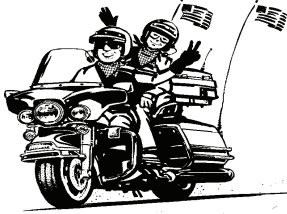
The Red Knights MC recently traveled to Ocala, FL., for their State Meeting where Jack Downs, the International President, reviewed and updated state and national issues.

This was another good year for Nova Scotia Chapter 1, who is thankful to have had a safe season. Their members got together for rides on a fairly regular basis and they made some inroads with some of the other local motorcycle groups, and gained many new friends along the way.
