It's worse than you think More evidence of distracted drivers

If you think distracted drivers are potentially dangerous, you're right. What's really scary is how many drivers are multi-tasking out there on the road.

According to a recent survey from the industry group Network of Employers for Traffic Safety:

- 10 percent of drivers have done work-related tasks while driving, either by reviewing notes, talking on the phone or using a computer.
- 18 percent have applied makeup while driving.
- 32 percent of drivers admit to having read while driving.
- 39 percent have tended to children while driving.
- 51 percent say they use a cell phone while driving.

DERRY, NH — Red Knights New Hampshire Chapter 1 raised \$1,932 through an 85-mile motorcycle ride last September helping with the community goal in Derry of putting defibrillators in all public buildings in town.

Firefighter Rob DeGroot, a member of New Hampshire-1 presented the check to the Town Council to help fund *Heart Safe Derry*. In addition to helping businesses and local organizations purchase defibrillators, Heart Safe Derry holds free monthly training sessions on cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and the use of defibrillators.

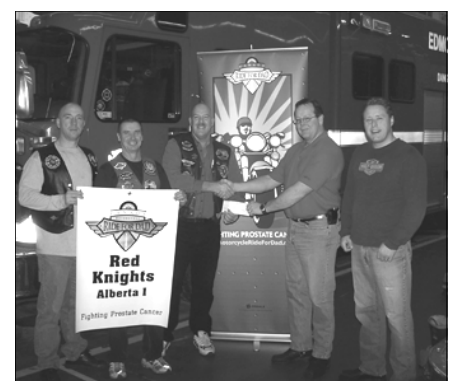

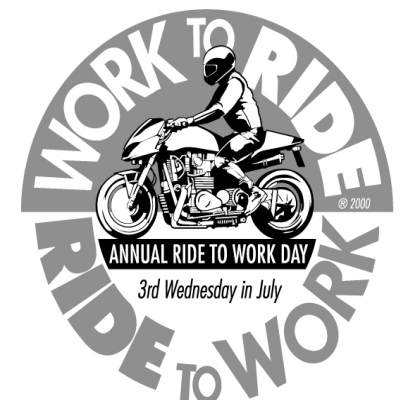

The following by-law changes are endorsed by the International Board

There are five proposed bylaws changes or additions. The changes/additions are in italics.

SECTION 1:04 A INSIGNIA PLACEMENT (change)

b. A top rocker showing membership status may be worn as listed in Section 2:01 of the By-Laws or another option available is a top rocker that reads "RED KNIGHTS" or "FIREFIGHTER"

SECTION 2:01 MEMBERSHIP CLASSIFICATION AND TENURE (NEW)

VI. An Active member can if they so wishes be a member of more than one chapter at a time. They must pay the same dues as other members of the chapter that they chooses to join and shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of an Active member in that chapter.

SECTION 5:06 SOCIAL MEMBERSHIP (change)

Social members shall be a Spouse, Partner, Boyfriend, Girlfriend, Son, Daughter, Brother or Sister of an Active Member, Associate Member or a Member-at-Large. *The minimum age for a social member shall be 16 years of age before joining.*

SECTION 5:07 SPECIAL HONORARY MEMBER (change)

Each Chartered Chapter may grant Special Honorary Membership status to a member of a recognized religion for the position of Chapter Chaplain. Special Honorary Membership may also be granted to a civic or business leader who does volunteer work for the Chapter. (REMOVE THIS LINE) *Special Honorary Membership may also be granted to the widow or widower of an Active or Associate Member.*

(ADD THIS LINE) *The International dues for this membership classification is to be paid by the Chapter.*

SECTION 5:10 E-mail address of Record (NEW)

The Chapter mailing address and e-mail address of record will be that of the current Chapter President and Chapter Secretary. The Chapter Secretary shall maintain a current roster on file with the International. All communications from the International shall be forwarded to the proper Officer(s) or member. Communication to the International Executive Board shall be sent to the International Regional Director for distribution.

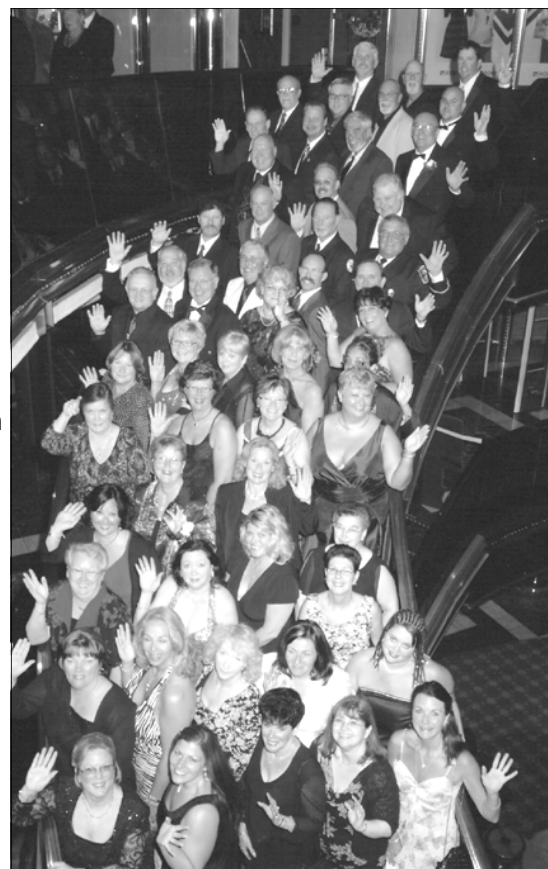

2007 Year End Report From Leo Patry - International Treasurer
January 1, 2008

Listed is my year-end report for January 1 2007 till December 31st 2007
As International treasurer I submitted to the board a quarterly report for all quarters of the 2007-year including an end of year report. I also provided the board up to date financial records and a report for all three Executive meetings held in 2007. In January of 2008 I mailed to the International Secretary a CD with a copy of all the Treasurers records as stored on the treasurer's Lap Top Computer.

I made hotel arrangements for all Executive board meetings held during the year as well as arrangements for air flights for those members required to fly in to attend.

Meetings were held: April 12, 13, 14, 15, 2007 in Syracuse New York; August 15, 2007 Worcester Massachusetts; and November 9, 10, 11, 2007 Syracuse New York.

Set up and maintained a tracking database for funds donated by the chapters for the Red Knight Memorial. Also set up and maintained a record of all promotional grants given to the chapters and Associations of the Red Knights Organization along with all grant funding provided to the chapters and Associations for multi-chapter events for the Red Knights Membership.

Did considerable research into the opening of a second bank account and investment fund for the Red Knights Organization in the State of New York. An Investment fund was opened in the month of June, this fund will be reviewed by the Executive board at all its meetings and at that time a decision will be made as to the availability of additional funds to be transferred from the general account to the investment account. At the November meeting the decision was made to transfer additional funds to the investment account, which was done on November 29th 2007.

On January 10, 2007 I began the process of obtaining three additional service marks from the United States and Canadian patent office. I filled out the paperwork and started the process of our acquiring additional Trademark protection through the law firm of Christopher & Weisberg P.A. to obtain three service marks to go with our Red Knights Logo those being: Red Knights International Firefighters Motorcycle Club; Red Knights; and RKMC

This process will also be applied to Canada once the US patent has been completed the whole process for the U.S.A. should take approximately 18 months and three to four months longer for the Canadian patent. The cost for this will run around 16,000.00 dollars total we have already paid \$13,706.46 of this and expect to have the process completed by spring of 2008.

On March 17, 2007 I filed the Red Knights corporate tax return with the I.R.S. unfortunately because of a lack of information from the Quartermaster's accounts this resulted in the IRS on June 11, 2007 sending the Corporation a letter regarding errors and omissions on the filing form which resulted in my refiling a corrected Tax report on July 17, 2007

On August 22nd 2007 I filed the annual report with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts in regards to our articles of incorporation.

On the 16th of November 2006 I filed the certificate of revocation of appointment of a resident agent to change our resident agent from Don Staples to Ed Brouillet this was still pending till just prior to our filing of this year's corporate report with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Spent 1321 hours (29 hours per week) during the period of Jan 1 – Dec 31 2007 dealing with Emails, phone calls, and correspondence related to the duties of International treasurer with approximately another 2 hours per week spent on Internationals Banking requirements. Averaging out to 31 hours per week.

The above mentioned times are also above the time required to attend Executive meetings and the business conducted at the Internationals business meeting held each August.

At this time I would like very much to thank all the members of the International Executive for all the help and encouragement they have provided me in a very hard and trying year.

I would also like to extend a warm welcome to the new members of the executive board for all their efforts on behalf of the membership and the team building that has continued over the past couple of years to bring the board to the level it is now, without that drive and devotion the organization would not be able to survive.

4 Mental & Physical Traps to Watch Out For on the Road... thought provoking tips from the AMA

Riding a bike keeps you in the elements, which is great, but it can also tire you out quickly. So always be on the lookout for:

Dehydration. Long days on the bike—or even short ones on hot days—can dry you out much faster than you realize. Either use a hydration system or take frequent breaks to drink fluids.

The Stupids. If you find your mind getting a bit foggy—say, you can't decide whether to stop for a break or not—take it for the warning sign that it is and stop. Are you hungry? Thirsty? Tired? Figure out what's wrong and fix it before you get back on the bike.

Small Pains that Could Turn Into Big Ones. Sitting in one position for long periods of time can cause muscle soreness. Tightening up? Stretch your muscles (safely) on the bike, or better yet, stop and walk around. A few minutes off the bike can buy you an hour or more of comfort back on it.

That Voice. If that voice in your head is telling you to stop for the night, or that another 100 miles may be too much before lunch, or that you're riding too fast, or anything else, do yourself a favor and listen.

Information on Chapter Bylaws

In the fall 2007 newsletter, the By-Laws Committee announced that the Board is starting over with Chapter By-Laws and is now keeping them on computer instead of in a paper form. All Chapter By-Laws that have not been examined and accepted by the By-Laws committee since August of 2007 should be resubmitted for review and acceptance.

All chapters are asked to resubmit any previous Chapter By-Laws or download the generic Chapter By-Laws from the web page and adjust them for their own use and send them to the By-Laws committee for acceptance. Chapters have the option of creating their own By-Laws, for specific local concerns, as long as those By-Laws do not undermine or subvert the International By-Laws. Local By-Laws may not be more stringent than International By-Laws. Any chapter that wishes to forgo Chapter By-Laws and simply run under the International By-Laws is asked to contact the By-Laws Committee and say as much. A simple e-mail will suffice.

We have between two and three hundred chapters. At this time, there have been only twenty-seven chapters who have submitted their proposed bylaws. In addition, five chapters have notified the Committee that they are using the International By-Laws. I examined all the proposed bylaws that were submitted, made the suggestions of corrections needed to be acceptable to International and sent them back to the chapters. Of all the bylaws sets that I sent back to the chapter to change, seven chapters have not returned the corrected version.

There is a disturbing resemblance in the proposed By-Laws sets that were sent back to the chapters for change, including those that have not been returned. There are three procedural items with which these by-laws sets have in common.

1. Chapters are requiring new members to purchase the patch set as a condition of joining the Red Knights. They are either charging a ridiculously large initiation fee to cover the cost or telling the new member they must just come up with the money. Either way, they are requiring that a new member buy patches in order to join.

The Red Knights Club does NOT require our new members to purchase the patches, nor does the Board look kindly on exorbitant initiation fees or other burdens placed on new members. Simply stated, the local chapter has no right to place additional requirements on membership that are not specified in the International By-Laws.

2. A retiring member must give their patches back to the Chapter.

Along with the patch purchase requirement, many of these Chapters are also requiring that the member relinquish their patches upon leaving the Club. Once again, we discussed this at the Board level and reaffirmed that the patches belong to the member and the Chapter has no right to demand them back. We did discuss that the Chapter could ask for the patches to be sold to them or another member.

3. The mantra of the 1% motorcycle club is being followed by a few chapters.

The Red Knights International Motorcycle Club ® is NOT a 1% club. How much more plainly can this be stated?

- We do not prospect members.
- We do not place any new member (other than an Associate member) on any type of probation.

The patches are the property of the individual, not the club and are earned by being voted into the chapter when they apply for membership. They earned the right to wear the patches because of present or former service on a fire department not by any form of servitude or gauntlet placed upon them by a local chapter. If you feel that you must follow the rules of a 1% club, you might consider joining a 1% club.

It is the opinion of the By-Laws Committee and the International Board that if your chapter is conducting business with the use of any of these three procedural items, you contact your State Rep or Regional Rep immediately so that the International Board can investigate the situation.

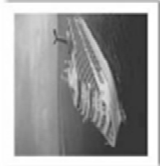
