# Voting rights at the Conventions

During the convention, each Chapter's voting delegate shall signin with the Nominations/Voting committee before the beginning of the Annual Business Meeting (ABM). The delegate will receive a wrist band showing him/her as the voting delegate.

If the Chapter delegate at the Annual Business Meeting is a member other than the Chapter President, then that representative shall have a letter from the Chapter President designating him or her as the Chapter Delegate for voting purposes. International Grants for Chapters and State/Provincial Associations

Each year the International Treasurer shall set aside \$1600.00 to be made available to the chapters and or State/ Provincial Associations to help them in the promotion of the Organization.

The funds will be allotted on first come application basis, on a matching dollar amount up to \$200.00 per application, until the yearly allowance is depleted.

All applications would be reviewed by the executive board and the best eight (8) would be selected for the grants this year.

The money is to be used for registration fees, equipment or printed material that will help promote our organization with the aim of attracting new members or chapters.

# From the Secretary-Bill Snodgrass

### **INSURANCE UPDATE:**

I would like to remind all chapters that when requesting insurance for your events that I need the complete address of all stops/additional insurers (number, street, city, state/province and zip code). By submitting this information the first time it will save time in processing your request. Please submit your request for information and/or price quote three (3) weeks before your event. If the checks for the insurance are not received at least ten (10) business days before the date of the event, they will be returned to you and you will not be able to obtain the insurance. This is due to chapters sending in checks on Monday for insurance on the following Saturday or Sunday.

The process is that the certificate of insurance is not ordered until the checks arrive, the request for insurance is submitted to the insurance company, they process the request; send the certificate of insurance to the Secretary who then mails it and the waivers to the chapter/association requesting the insurance. As you can see this takes more than 3 or 4 days.

We had to change the process on the waiver deposit because many chapters are having problems with their banks cashing checks from outside the U.S. Some banks are charging \$40.00 to cash or deposit a \$50.00 check. Because of that, we are now asking that chapters/associations submit two checks, one in the amount of the insurance and the other in the amount of \$50.00 for the waiver deposit. The Secretary will hold the waiver deposit check for a period of thirty days after the date of the event. If the waivers are returned in that thirty day period the check will be returned to the chapter/ association. If the waivers are not returned within the thirty day period, the chapter/association will forfeit the deposit (it will be sent to the International Treasurer) and they will also have to deposit \$100.00 the next time they apply for insurance and failing to return the waiver forms within the allotted 30 days a second time will disqualify them from insurance coverage for two years.

# TRADEMARK LICENSED: A

Trademark License (TML) is required for use by all chapters/association on every item that has our name or logo. The chapter/association can request one TML for the chapter's web site, flyers (to promote the chapter), checks, chapter applications and address labels. If your chapter does have a Trademark License Agreement for these items, please submit one ASAP. For all other items the chapter/ association must request a TML for each item (tee shirt, flag, banner, hat, chapter patch, ride pin, etc) from the International Secretary (secretary@redknightsmc.com) before placing an order. For these items a photo or drawing of the design must be submitted with the application. The Trademark license application can be downloaded from the International web page. Just follow the directions on it and submit it by e-mailto the International Secretary. The time frame for approval is 5-7 business days, depending on the postal system. There is not a charge or cost for the Trademark License Application or the Trademark License Agreement.

NOTICE OF DEATH OF MEMBER: Please submit any notice of the death of a Red Knight member to the International Secretary. The Secretary will add those name(s) to the Heaven One chapter data base to be read at the annual convention and will submit the name(s) to add to the Red Knight Memorial in Boylston, Mass. In the case of a LODD, a Red Knight flag maybe requested from the International Secretary at no cost for the member. For an accidental or natural cause death a flag maybe requested from the Secretary by the chapter at the normal cost.

# VOTING AT THE ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING:

This is a reminder to all chapters of Section 2-6 of the generic chapter bylaws and Section 17 of the International Rules and Regulations which reads: Section 2-6: (President) will be the Chapter Representative at International Meetings and State / Province Association Meetings. If He/she cannot attend. He/she will appoint another members in his/her place. Section 17: If the Chapter delegate at the Annual Business Meeting is a member other than the Chapter President, they shall have a letter from the Chapter President designating them as the Chapter Delegate for voting purposes.

As this will be enforced at the Annual Business meetings, Chapter Presidents

newsletter, letterheads, business cards, need to follow these guide lines.

### **CHARITY FUND RAISERS:**

As most of our chapters are involved in fund raising for different charities and raise a large amount of money for different charities each year. We would like to have a running total at the end of each year so that we may share the total amount with all of our membership and the public. After the chapter event is over please submit the total amount that is given to charity to the International Secretary.

# Red Knight of the Year Award

Congratulations to Tom Cooke, President of Indiana 1, on his recognition as the 2007 Red Knight of the Year!

It is the goal of the Red Knights International Motorcycle Club to identify and honor a member each year as the Red Knight of the Year. This award will be known as the "**Perry Carter Award**", in remembrance of Perry for his endless work and dedication to the Red Knights Motorcycle Club.

Only an active member in good standing with the International and their Chapter may be eligible for this award. This includes Members at Large.

Each Chapter may nominate a member from its Chapter for the Red Knight of the Year. The nomination should be sent to the State/ Province Representative and then to the Regional Director. Each Regional Director would then forward their nominee to the Eastern Regional Director who will serve as the Chairperson for this award. A Member at Large, Chapter President, or an Executive Board member of the Red Knights International Motorcycle Club may nominate any Member at Large for the award. This nomination would follow the same path as listed above.

The committee will consist of the Eastern Regional Director, as Chairperson, the past two recipients and the four Regional Directors.

Members who are nominated should have been present at 50% of the Red Knights Motorcycle Club chapter events during the year. The member nominated should have visited at least one other Chapter during the year. The member nominated should have attended the International Convention in the past. The Member nominated should represent and signify the Red Knight's standard in their dealings with the public and the International's members.

The Regional Director shall forward a letter with their nomination outlining the member's qualities shown for this award to the International President. The deadline for receiving the nomination shall be prior to March 1st of each year. The final decision will be made at the Spring Board meeting each year.

All members of this committee will be notified of the names and information that have been submitted to receive this award. They are to review those names and information on why they were nominated and submit their choice in order of first, second and third to the Committee Chairperson, no later that 14 days before the spring International Board Meeting.

The winner of this award shall receive recognition and their fee for the Annual Conference of the year they are receiving the award. The Red Knights International Motorcycle Club should pay for the registration to the annual Convention.

# Information on Chapter Bylaws

The By-Laws committee is in the process of updating all Chapter By-Laws. We are starting over. With only thirty Chapter By-Laws on file, we have stopped using the old hard copy format and are now using the digital storage on our computer. Do not send hard copies of your proposed By -Laws. They will not be processed.

All chapters who have not submitted or have not updated their By-Laws since August 18<sup>th</sup> 2007 are asked to download the Generic Chapter By-Laws Word document file from the International web site. http:// www.redknightsmc.org/membership/samplebylaws.htm Do not submit your proposed by-laws in a PDF format, they must be submitted to the By-Laws Committee in a Word document format.

You may make the changes you think necessary to the file and then submit it to the By-Laws Committee at this address. bylaws@redknightsmc.com

Your file will then be examined to make sure that any changes made are within the scope of the International By-Laws. Once the Committee and the Chapter have reached agreement on the By-Laws, a digitally signed and locked copy will be sent back to the Chapter and it will be stored on the By-Laws computer.

If your Chapter chooses to run solely under the International By-Laws, please send and email to

bylaws@redknightsmc.com stating your Chapter number and that you do not have an individual Chapter By-Law set and you will conduct business under International By-Laws.

We have almost three hundred Chapters and International and the By-Laws Committee would like to hear from all of you.

Rules for Chapter Web Page Link Inclusion on the Red Knights International Web Pages

- Web site must be controlled entirely by a Chapter, not an individual. The Chapter is responsible for all content on the Web site.
- The local Chapter must control all links that are placed on the web pages. Links must reflect the standards of the Red Knights.
- If the Chapter has a bulletin board, it must be maintained it so that nothing is kept that does not reflect the standards of The Red Knights.
- The Chapter must obtain a Trademark License Agreement from International before posting a Web site on the Internet. A "blanket agreement" is available that will cover the Chapter Web site, Chapter stationery, Chapter business cards, etc.. Any Chapter who does not obtain a TMA will be told to remove all trademarked material from their Chapter Web Site.
- Free web page providers that are "social networking sites", i.e. Facebook and Yahoo, are not acceptable for Chapter web pages.

# A tool box talk on Staying Safe ...

(Portions of this are from the "Education Vacation " column by Adam Zuckerman in the November 2007 edition of Roadbike Magazine).

No matter how long you have been a rider or how old you are in years, motorcycle safety training will always give you new views and new skills to take to the streets. One such program available that gives you advanced motorcycle training on real world roads is Lawrence Grodsky's Stayin' Safe Motorcycle Training.

Larry Grodsky was widely recognized as the leading motorcycle safety expert in the country. And much of his work was devoted to creating the Stayin' Safe Motorcycle Training program that has set the standard for on-street, real-world training. Even since Larry's passing, the Staying safe program has remained active and is a unique opportunity for riders to improve their street skills.

The class sizes are very small with one instructor to three riders that are all inter-connected via two-way radios. The instructor then can constantly give feedback to the riders about road hazards, conditions, and the riders' interactions with each other and the world around them.

Three fundamentals of the training program that each of us can use in our daily lives on our bikes are (1) 360 degree awareness, (2) Put the bike where they cannot touch you, and (3) No surprises.

**360 degree awareness** means seeing the activity and landscape in all directions, including far off the road. Fences, trees, and telephone poles hint at where and how sharply the road might curve. Mail boxes suggest loose gravel and turning cars. Cow pastures imply slow-moving farm equipment and the mud they can leave behind.

**Put the bike where they can't touch you** means choosing a lane position that addresses the situation. In real traffic, hazards come along in twos, threes, and dozens at a time. So a rider needs to decide which are the biggest threats and choose their lane position and speed accordingly. You must maximize your following distance and visability to other motorists.

**No surprises** means putting it all together to see everything and be ready for anything.

Another Stayin' Safe technique is "clearing the view." This is a term for looking further ahead than most riders would: trying to see through the trees or across valleys so that a rider can see what is coming long before it arrives.

Not only should each of us take formal rider training that is available through MSF courses and other training opportunities like the Staying Safe program—but each ride we go on should be used to hone our skills and become better, safer riders.

### **RED KNIGHTS MEMORIAL DONATIONS**

# Protection from SMIDSY (Sorry Mate, I didn't see you)

Just over one third of all motorcycle crashes are single vehicle crashes where you can only blame yourself or road conditions. But if you are in a crash with another vehicle, the chances are high that it will be the fault of the other driver. Research into motorcycle crashes shows that the other driver is at fault in about 70% of motorcycle crashes with other vehicles.

In many of these crashes the driver will say they simply didn't see the motorcycle until it was too late. (Sorry Mate I Didn't See You - SMIDSY).

The situation may be getting worse. In the past, the driving landscape was made up of 95% cars and station wagons. The increasing proportion of taller vehicles has changed the landscape so it is harder to see and be seen across traffic. This is particularly a problem for vulnerable road users such as pedestrians, cyclists and motorcyclists.

What can you do to protect yourself?

In a recent survey of drivers, 55% reported having at least one experience of having seen a motorcyclist only at the last minute when they were changing lanes.

Other research has found that drivers who are unfamiliar with motorcycles are significantly more likely to have a crash with a motorcycle. This means that people who do not ride, or know someone else who rides, are more likely to crash into a motorcycle.

Motorcycle awareness programs for drivers are essential, but it is also up to you to "stack the deck" in your favor. Do what ever you can to draw their attention.

What you wear can make a difference some of the time. You need to be within the other driver's line of vision and your clothing must stand out against the background.

In one recent study, riders wearing any reflective or fluorescent clothing had a 37% lower risk than other riders. Riders wearing white helmets had a 24% lower risk than those wearing black helmets. The study was conducted in mainly urban areas. Day time headlights may also help but again, only if they make you stand out against the rest of the traffic.

Size does appear to make a difference. Small motorcycles have a smaller profile and are even less visible from the front or rear. You need all the help you can get to stand out.

- Do not ever assume they have seen you.
- Do not weave between lanes in moving heavy traffic.
- Learn to recognize each vehicle's blind spot and stay our of them.
- Try to stay long enough in each driver's rear vision mirror to make sure they have seen you before you move on.
- Use your horn or rev your engine to draw attention if you think you haven't been seen.
- Move within your lane to improve your chance of being seen.
- When riding in traffic and your lane is moving freely but the lane beside you has slowed or stopped, watch out for impatient drivers suddenly moving into your lane.

- <u>Social member</u> The spouse, boyfriend (1) Girlfriend (1) offspring's of an Active or Associate member or member-at-Large. See Section 4:06
- <u>Special Honorary Member</u> Granted to a person of a recognized religion for the position of chapter chaplain. See Section 4:07
- <u>Member-at-Large</u> Person's who qualify for Active membership but are too far removed from any established chapter to join. See Sections 2:01 & 2:01A
- <u>Life membership</u> See Section 2:01
- <u>Compassionate Honorary Member</u> See Section 2:01 (8)
