2024 R.K.M.C. Heaven One Honors:

As I oversee the R.K. Member-At-Large (M.A.L.) Membership worldwide, it is also with a heavy heart that I announce the passing of one (1) Member-At-Large, since my last EOY Report. Godspeed. May you rest in peace. RKF.

State of the Member-At-Large (M.A.L.) Program:

12-31-24: We have 306 R.K.M.C., Member-At-Large Members: 258 Active/41 Social/ 7 Junior

In 2024 we received 108 R.K.M.C., Member-At-Large applications and I've worked on an additional 44 from previous years. 68 have been approved as MAL, 35 have been referred to chapters, 2 transferred from chapters to MAL and 2 were denied membership, the rest are still pending. We also had 14 Member-at-Large resign from the Club. The biggest note of all is that we have accepted 14 MALs in Finland bringing the total to 16. They do not live close to each other, but they may work on 1 National Chapter, similar to Norway 1.

VICE PRESIDENT - NORM BEAUSOLEIL

In accordance with the By-Laws Article 2, Section 2:10 3. International Dues:

It is unfortunate I report that there are 89 Member-At-Large Members on restricted service.

- 31 have not paid dues since 2022 and have removed from the roster,
- 27 have not paid since 2023, are now 2 years in arears, and in jeopardy of being removed, and
- 62 have not renewed for 2025 and are now 1 year in arears.

All have been advised that they are now on restricted service.

We do hope that you take this opportunity to renew your membership and return to in good standing status. If you are an MAL and have not received a "Dues Reminder" e-mail from me, please send an e-mail to <u>vicepresident@redknightsmc.com</u>. The most likely cause is an incorrectly recorded or copied email address on the roster – mistakes happen.

If you are an MAL and have dues owed, please contact the International Treasurer, Scott Ryan, at <u>treasurer@redknightsmc.com</u>.

Member-at-Large Program Update:

As manager of the Member-at-Large Program (the Program) I have a great deal of freedom with the process, and I would like to pass my thoughts on to all of you, particularly chapter leadership and those members that move away from your "home" chapter.

The Red Knights is an organization based on **Chapter Membership**, and the Program <u>was</u> designed to allow the Club to gain exposure in areas where we are not established. It is **designed to be a starting point to eventual chapter membership**, it was not designed to be an endpoint membership location for chapter members to transfer to. For example, a motorcycling firefighter in Colorado, Saskatchewan or Latvia hears about us and asks to join. Voila, a perfect MAL candidate. We have no chapter in the state, province or country yet, so the MAL program can do just what it was designed to do – RKMC exposure in a remote area. New member, new place, no question.

Where I am taking a different approach is this: **First**, I am asking current chapter members that move to **seriously consider** several things before I approve a transfer to MAL.

Let's say a member from MA 1 moves to Colorado. That member is already a Red Knight, and, although the By-Laws (Section 2:06(2)) allow a transfer to MAL due to a "travel hardship" – and I won't necessarily deny the request – I will first ask 3 very serious questions.

- 1. Why do you want to leave your chapter?
- 2. Why do you want to be an MAL? Based on your answers to 1 and 2, I will ask
- 3. Why should (or would) I approve your request to become an MAL? Remember, we are a **Chapter Based** organization, and a chapter member is able to represent us in a new area, and with their access to information from their (current) chapter, i.e. newsletters, e-mails, contacts, etc., they can do the same job as an MAL, including starting a new chapter, with the benefit of current chapter support.

VICE PRESIDENT - NORM BEAUSOLEIL

Member-at-Large Program Update, Continued:

You might say that that member won't be an active member of the chapter – he/she won't make meetings, rides, events, parties, etc. I SAY, SO WHAT? I'll bet every chapter already has local members that fit that description. Having that member move away won't affect chapter activities, will it? And, this Club does not approve or condone attendance requirements EXCEPT at the International Board level. Finally, the member that has moved will benefit more from being included in all communications from their chapter. Who loses? I don't see anyone suffering from that scenario.

Second, I'll now reverse the roles a bit. Let's say I receive an MAL application from a prospective member who lives in Florida, 100 miles from any other chapter. I have been referring those applicants to ALL chapters in the state, listing closest first, and **asking the chapter presidents**, along with the respective state/province/country reps and the regional directors, to ALL reach out to the applicant and invite that applicant to join their chapter, for EXACTLY the same reasons as above. I can only see good things coming to a chapter that can get additional members and a remote member that isn't "active" will still be in the loop and may surprise you, where an MAL may not even know your chapter exists. Once again, who loses? This one is a win-win. Once again, I won't <u>necessarily</u> deny the application, but if someone wants to be a member, and chapter membership is available <u>and</u>, on the table, why should that applicant refuse?

This is where I need your help – yes, every one of you that is already a member of the RKMC. Welcome and/or invite new members and be open to receiving new members, no matter how far away they live, into your chapters. If they are active look at the benefits. If they are inactive, what have they changed? New blood can infuse new life.

In closing, I am looking forward to <u>2025 AND BEYOND</u> in serving you, the members, to the best of my ability. Thank you for trusting me and, to my wife Kathy, thanks for putting up with me and being the best travel partner a guy could ask for! I hope to see you on the road, or at any of the many upcoming Red Knights events, rides and rallies in 2025, particularly the Yankee in Bangor, Maine, the International Convention in Peoria, Illinois, and the EuCon Rally in Florence, Italy, among other possibilities.

As a member of the International Board for one term now, I've had the chance to learn a great deal about the dynamics of this organization. There have been joyful moments, as well as some challenging times. I've realized that we don't always have all the facts in any situation, and it's important to communicate with one another. Most



of the time, we find that what we think we know is just a story or a misunderstanding. After all, we are all human!

During my last year as your International Secretary, I have had the privilege of attending several important events, including the 2024 International Spring Board Meeting, the 2024 Dixie Rally, the 2024 International Convention, the 2024 Bootleggers Rally, the 2024 International Fall Board Meeting, and, sadly, a few Heaven One services. I cherish the experiences and memories created at each of these events. I look forward to many more years of building bonds, friendships, and unforgettable memories!

Over the past year, I have been busy transforming the TMLA (Trademark License Agreement) system into a fully digital platform, and I am pleased to report that it is nearly complete. The final step is to create an educational program to help our members understand and feel comfortable using the system. With over 4,000 TMLAs in place, this has been a challenging task, but we will continue to work on improving it for our global membership.

Please remember that this system is designed to protect our names and logo from misrepresentation and is not intended to create difficulties or internal strife among our members. One aspect that seems to be commonly misunderstood is the use of the ® symbol. Our intellectual property attorney has clarified its usage: the ® symbol is not compulsory in any jurisdiction where we hold registrations, but it is highly recommended. When I mention this, members often ask what it means. To clarify, the ® is not required, but its use is strongly encouraged, and I will always ask that it be placed on our products. If the symbol is not included, it does not make the item illegal, and I will not disapprove an item solely for the absence of the ®.

If you are unsure whether an item requires a TMLA, please fill out an application along with a picture and send it to me. If the item involves any of our protected names or logos, the answer will always be yes. I'm here to assist you and am always happy to help.

TREASURER - SCOTT RYAN

I have lost track of how many meetings I attended in 2024, but I do know I attended all the International Board meetings that were called – in person and virtually. This included, of course, the Annual meeting in Leipzig.

For me, in one way, it was a quieter year regarding rallies. I wasn't able to attend as many regional rallies as I have in the past but I was able to, with my chapter, host a very successful Atlantic Association Rally.



I was honoured at the European Association President's Meeting this year to be recognized for the distance I had ridden in 2023. A part of that accomplishment included over 7,000 km in South-East Europe. In 2024, I was fortunate to put on another 7,000 km in Europe, this time taking a loop around the Baltic Sea. There certainly is some beautiful riding in Region 7! That said, I definitely encourage those of you in Regions 1-6 to get out and explore, the variety of landscape, architecture, and personalities throughout North America can make for some great adventures as well. Region 8, I'm looking forward to having good things to report about your area after convention 2026!

I have recently updated the chapter roster spreadsheet I send each chapter in the fall of the year. It now includes a note at the bottom of the dues tab with instructions on how to pay through our website. The more often Chapter Treasurers pay dues, the easier it gets, but Chapter Treasurers change frequently so little tricks like this are helpful. If any Treasurers out there want additional tips and tricks in the annual dues spreadsheet, let me know, they can be added.

At the convention in 2024 we added some clarity to our Social Membership. This was spurred by me seeing inconsistent interpretations amongst Chapters. There was great discussion on the floor about this and I would like to point out that eligibility is not automatic membership. At the time I did not fully appreciate the comments of how this change could dilute our membership. My thoughts were similar to another member who noted the challenges around Junior Members and him being able to bring his son into the club but not his step-son. It was these types of situations I had in mind. On the other side I can see how it could be "watering down" our membership if my 80 year-old father remarried and I brought all my new step-brothers and step-sisters into the club. Although either of these situations are now eligible, I would hope the Chapter would consider the validity of the second scenario before voting to approve those relatives. To help understand if this change did fully clarify Social Membership, please, when you submit a new Social Member, in addition to noting who their sponsor is, include what the relationship is.

Once again, thank you to all the Chapter Officers and others who I have worked with over the year, I'm here to make your jobs easier so you can just have fun and ride. I appreciate how so many of you make that possible for me as well. Something that can make it even easier for you and for me, when you are submitting roster updates with added members, please make a note if they are already members of another chapter and which one is their Home Chapter. With 10,000 members, I don't recognize all the names, if a name pops up on your chapter roster that wasn't on the last version, I assume they are a New Member and look for \$20.

REGION 1 DIRECTOR - KEN MAY

To My Red Knight Family,

It's hard to believe that 2025 is here and another year is behind us. Region 1 has grown slightly over this past year adding a total of 22 members to the overall membership in the Northeast. But as we grow we must and will always remember the 17 Region 1 members that have passed during 2024 and are now memorialized in Boylston, Mass.

Region 1 consists of:

- 8 States
- 98 Chapters
- 2,772 Chapter Members
- 31 Members at Large
- · 2,803 Total Members

I need to start my report with the 2024 Dixie Rally which was held in Statesville, North Carolina. I wasn't registered to attend the rally, due to prior commitments, one in New Hampshire and the other in Maine. So, on May 16th, I was heading to Boylston, Massachusetts to stay for the evening at the Red Knights Memorial Hall. It's amazing how receiving one phone call can change your plans in a second. That call told me that my son was involved in a motorcycle accident while attending the Dixie Rally. He was taken to the area Trauma Center with sever back pain. Well, after driving 5 hours North, I turned around and started an 800-mile trip south to North Carolina. I received numerous phone calls and messages from Red Knights, some whom I didn't even know. Most just wanting to make sure I was okay driving and others updating me on my son's condition. I even received calls making sure I would have a place to stay once I arrived in North Carolina. I finally arrived at around 2:00 AM, to find Red Knights still up waiting for me so they can pass along what they knew. Later that day I found out that my son had broken several vertebrae in his back, but thankfully sustained no serious damage. Once released from the hospital he would need to stay in NC for several more days before heading home to New Jersey. A North Carolina Red Knight made sure we didn't stay in a hotel, and they put us up in their home. My son had to wear a back brace for several months and then Physical Therapy. The support my family received from members of NC, NJ, NY, IN, MA, GA and even Switzerland was amazing. I would also like to report that because of the Fellowship, Friendship and now Family, my son has fully recovered and just this past December purchased a new HD Road Glide.

As Regional Director it is one of my duties to attend meetings, not only with the International, but with the Region 1 States and when possible, the Chapters. So, this past year I attended all 3 In-Person International Board Meetings along with the 8 Zoom Meetings they held. I also attended State and/or Chapter meetings in Maine, New Hampshire, New Jersey and New York, bringing back to the Region One membership information as to what is happening not only Internationally, but locally throughout the Region.

It was an unexpected honor when I attended the 2024 April meeting of the New Jersey State Association, where I was shocked as they presented me with the NJ Red Knight of the Year, better known as the "Barry Stires Award." It was literally the first time I was speechless.



This was one of the few years in the recent past where we did not have any contested races for the positions up for election or had to administer a Special Election to fill a vacancy. We did respond to requests for information and had to process incumbent officers running for re-election to ensure continued compliance and eligibility. There was one open position for Regional Director in Region 6, which was filled without a challenge.



The Committee wrote the Committee Procedural Manual and updated the Nominee Profile which will be implemented for the 2025 nomination process which opens January 1, 2025. 






6th Annual Suicide Awareness Ride

Carl is a 10 plus year Charter member of Red Knights GA3 and recently became the president of the chapter. He is a 28-year retired Sergeant with Columbus Fire & EMS in Columbus, Georgia. After retiring in 2019, He joined his local Volunteer Fire Department in Cataula, Georgia. Like many firefighters he came from a family of firefighters. His father and grandfather were firefighters in Derby and Seymour Connecticut where he grew up. Carl grew up around the fire house and always knew he would be destined to follow in his family's footsteps. After relocating to Georgia in his teens, and a

career in the printing industry after high school Carl was accepted into the Fire Academy, He knew his calling in life had been fulfilled and my father's hopes of passing on his legacy came to fruition. His father was able to pin his badge on him after graduating from the fire academy. 28 years later after retiring he focused on riding, his motorcycle parts business, and building the 9/11 Firefighter Memorial motorcycle. Carl has ridden motorcycles since he was in his teens, owning 6 bikes from enduros to touring to a drag bike. He didn't get his first car until he was in his twenties.

This handcrafted motorcycle has been transformed to look like a Fire Truck and is a rolling tribute to the 343 Firefighters killed during the attacks at the World Trade Center on 9/11. I've made this motorcycle to look like a firetruck. Complete with hoses, a ladder, air tanks, and the iconic bell at the front of the motorcycle at which the bike is notably named "Belle". The dash of the motorcycle has the names of the Firefighters that were lost that day. The bike has a clock that has stopped at 08:46 AM, the time when the first plane hit the first tower.

Carl takes this 2003 Harley Davidson Firefighter 9/11 Memorial motorcycle to various shows, rallies and charity fundraising events throughout the Southeastern United States to honor the 9/11 Firefighters and in their remembrance to "Never Forget".



The 'Viking Master' Tour Explained



In 2021, Rasmus Lillemose and I came up with the idea of the Viking Master Tour. The aim was to ride another challenge in addition to the Grand Tour Master and get to know as much of Denmark as possible.

The entire tour consists of 4 subtasks. Each partial task must be completed within one year. Specifically, there is the DANMARK Tour, in which you have to drive to a fire station whose town begins with each letter in the word Danmark. In the 5 Regions Tour, fire stations in the 5 different regions of Denmark must be visited and in the Compass

Tour, the northernmost, southernmost, easternmost and westernmost fire stations in Denmark must be visited. After completing the 3 tasks comes the enjoyable part. The Viking Master Patch can only be obtained in person, by participating in one of the DK1 parties, an excursion or a DK1 meeting. However, you only receive the patch if you have completed all the other tasks.

Here is the report on my Viking Master with some tips and recommendations:

The journey to Denmark is not worth mentioning, as it only involved the motorway, the Elbe tunnel and lots of traffic jams. Of course, you can also make the journey more interesting by taking smaller side roads, but time played a decisive role for me here.

My starting point for the tour was Vojens in Syddanmark, where I stopped at the first fire station (5 regions) on the first day of the actual tour. I continued via Rødding (Danma R k) to Hvide Sande (Compass West), which took me directly to the second region, Midtjylland. A little further inland, the fire stations (5 Regions) and Års (D A nmark) were on my list. The first day came to an end in Års after 303 kilometres on



small roads with a maximum speed of 80km/h. Those who like the north of Germany will feel at home in the regions of Syd- and Midtjylland.



Day 2 of the tour went north, past Dronninglund (D anmark), Ålbæk (5 regions) to the northernmost fire station in Skagen in Nordjylland. A great holiday region, lots of beaches and German is understood almost everywhere. To start the next day and for my early ferry crossing, I took the motorway back to Randers, where the second day ended after 351 km.

The third day had to be changed slightly. The original plan to take the Ebeltoft - Sjællands Odde ferry had to be changed to the Aarhus - Sjællands Odde ferry due to the closure of Ebeltoft harbour. Tip: get the app from Molslinjen, here you can book tickets and see timetable changes. This app is also useful for the connection to Bornholm. From Sjællands Odde in Sjælland we travelled via Asnæs (next A for Danmark) and Mørkøv (Dan M ark), on to Næstved (Da N mark). After the ferry crossing and arrival in Sjællands Odde, the real holiday began for me. After the typical holiday regions of Nord-, Midtjylland and Syddanmark, here you have peace and quiet for the most part and can enjoy the fantastic landscape with every metre. I booked the night ferry from Køge for the crossing to Bornholm, so after the fire station in Gedser (Compass South) I travelled via Præstø Havn (motorbike meeting point, delicious ice cream, great food) towards Køge. The day ended at about 410 kilometres.

Day 4 started at 0.30 a.m. with the night ferry to Rønne on Bornholm. If you choose this crossing, you will arrive on Bornholm at 6.00 am. All cafés and bakeries are closed at this time. Have a coffee on the ferry, the next one is at 8.00 am. Bornholm is small, in 100km you have travelled once around the island. So don't rush, enjoy the time and the scenery. Keep as far south as possible from Rønne towards Nexø, where there are great beaches and plenty of sea to see. For



the Compass Tour, visit the guardhouse in Nexø. Coffee and a small snack are available from 8.00 a.m. at Coffee Creative in the harbour. On the way back, we took the northern route back towards Rønne, along the cliffs with lovely little harbour towns and lots of sights. Just follow the signs on your tour. I spent the night at Hotel Skovly, great breakfast, nice accommodation and a short drive to the harbour in Rønne.



Day 5 began with another ferry crossing, this time to Ystad, Sweden. If you're still working on the alphabet tour, here's the Y. After a 1.5-hour ferry crossing with the fast ferry, we travelled briefly through Sweden and over the Øresund Bridge back to Denmark. Book your ticket for the bridge online beforehand, so you

can drive straight hrough the control with licence plate recognition and don't have to book a crossing at the terminal.

On the way to the island of Orø, where the last fire station and a party were waiting for me, I had to stop at Kirke Hyllinge (Danmar K) and Skibby (Hovedstaden region). I took the last photo of the fire stations on the island of Orø in the harbour. I had now also completed the Sjælland region. Now it was time for the cosy part of the trip, the annual MC Iceland party.

All in all, it was about 1,600 kilometres in Denmark, plus the journey there and back. Every kilometre was worth it. Next time, I would plan even fewer motorways, but rather one more day of travelling, and perhaps make a detour to the island of Fyn.

After the trip, my personal favourites are Bornholm and the area around Sjællands Odde and Asnæs. Great views, great motorbike routes.

Use the apps offered by the ferries, so you always have an up-to-date overview of which ferries are travelling when.

Card payment is possible everywhere, if not (only happened to me once), you will find a solution together. I, for example, was able to pay for my coffee in euros.

Every Dane speaks English, especially in the holiday regions German is also understood.

Use ferry connections, they are not that expensive. A 5-hour ferry connection to Bornholm cost me €33. WIFI included. Far cheaper than the Rostock or Puttgarden ferry connections.

If you have any questions, you can find out more on our website <u>www.RKMCDK1.eu</u>. The members of DK 1 will also be happy to help.

Please make sure to use GEO-tagging for your photos, which works well with the free GPS Map Camera app, for example.

The real aim is to have a 'hygge' time. Get into conversation with people (any harbour café is an ideal place) and enjoy the landscape, which could hardly be more different. Have a good time in Denmark.

Ride to Hadrian's Wall 2024

Many of you will probably know something about Hadrian's Wall. It crosses northern England, but is not the border with Scotland, that is further north.

About three years ago I organised a chapter ride to this ancient monument, but only three of us went. Clearly the word spread, when I asked at the International Convention in Fussach, if anyone was interested in another visit, I was surprised by the enthusiastic response. We achieved an international event when Sven Coopman (the famous Belgian MAL), who is no stranger to many of you, said that he would attend.

I have organised trips to the Wall before, but never on this scale. The Inn where I normally book accommodation was too small, so we ended up occupying most of the Angel Inn, Corbridge, Northumberland. I wrote an itinerary and sent out route details. All done well in advance. All sorted? You might think so.

The evening before we were due to go, I was contacted by Dale Priestly, an England 2 Chapter member, who told me that the first Roman monument I had planned to visit was closed all week. I thought that this would not be a problem and consulted the English Heritage web site. The Fort that was my back up plan was, according to the official web site also closed for the week. I quickly checked the other places that I planned to visit and found to my great relief that they were all open as normal.

We all rendezvoused at Wetherby Services on the A1 at 09:30 and set off north at 10:00. The weather was kind, we had experienced a lot of rain for months, but the sun even made an appearance. En route to the first visit we passed one of the sites that the internet site confidently said was shut. It was very busy, clearly the website was wrong. I made a note and carried on to my revised visit. This turned out to be a piece of good luck. Birdoswald Fort is quite a long way west, in Cumbria, but has some unique features.





When we arrived, we were told that we were welcome to see the archaeological dig that was investigating the civilian village that had stood next to the fort. When we walked to the dig site, they had exposed the public bath house. The two men who stepped forward to tell us about the discovery were two of the UK's most eminent archaeologists. They were able to tell us a great deal about their investigation.

Once we had looked at the fort, which had been occupied for many years by a regiment of Auxiliary soldiers from Romania, we rode back east on the New Military Road (built in the C18th) to Corbridge for a shower, dinner and a few beers. Those of you who have attended events with England II will know that we only drink beer to be sociable so we settled in for a few drinks and a night of merriment and laughs before retiring to bed.



We were on the road at 09:30 the next morning for the ride to the Roman Army Museum.

This is part of the Vindolanda Trust and is a very high-quality exhibition. The Roman Fort of Magna stood at this site, though it had never been investigated by archaeologists. They're now on the second year of a five-year project to investigate the site. As a result, we were able to visit another live dig. They were excavating finds every few minutes, both from the fort and the civilian settlement.

The museum gives a very clear picture of the lives of the soldiers who were posted to the most northern part of the Roman Empire. It must have been a very hard life, but there were rewards for those who served their time and were honourably discharged.

You can buy a ticket for this museum that will also get admittance to Vindolanda 13km away on the same day. £16.50, it is good value.



We rode to Vindolanda (The White Field in English). We had all afternoon to look at this large site, with its superb museum. There has been an ongoing project to excavate the site since the 1970's and there is about another forty years' worth of digging to do. This fort is older than the wall and the Emperor Hadrian visited there on a tour of inspection immediately prior to the construction commencing.

We joined an official tour with a guide, who showed us important features of the site that included the fort and the village that accompanied it. There settlements were officially sanctioned to provide

leisure activities for the troops in such an isolated place.

Among the most important items found at this site are the Vindolanda Tablets. Small pieces of tree bark used in the way we use post cards. They include complains about poor supplies, a letter of thanks for some warm underwear and socks, an invoice for half a kilo of pepper (imported from India), and most importantly an invitation to a birthday party. It contains the earliest example of a woman's hand writing and signature in Europe.

Though sometimes you get "that visitor" who explains things for the guide.

Both these museums are incredibly informative, have good shops and nice cafes.



We returned to Corbridge, shower and change and because we're English (and a Belgian) we went for a curry. We can recommend the Valley Junction, a short walk from the inn, it is part of the railway station and the food and hospitality were first class.

On our last morning, we visited <u>Corbridge Roman Town</u>. When you see it now, it is a little confusing, because you are looking at the evidence of nearly four hundred years of occupation, and it isn't clear what related to which period unless you have studied very carefully. It is a good site and has a small, but very good museum.

After this we made our way south toward home. In time I will organise another tour of the UNESCO World Heritage Site.

If any of you are planning to visit the UK and want to see this beautiful and historic area, I would be pleased to give you any information I can or offer my services as a guide.


They will head North and grab Narre Warren Nth and Upwey before heading to the city and the Pullman.

The President of the Southern Warriors Jason Kelly, presided over Welcome to Country reciting the time-honored stories of the past, explaining the connections to the land, skies, rivers and animals of Australia, bestowing blessings and knowledge of country on us and our event. This is a powerfully emotional

experience, that one cannot help but feel pride and awe of the Australian Indigenous history. In the course of these proceedings Jason honored us with the presentation of a traditional Message Stick, binding our two clubs with respect and symbols of brotherhood.

The helmet artwork represents our creation spirit Bunjil and our ancestors and highlights our connection with other Kulin groups through ceremonies, trade, and ongoing relationships. As Taungurung, we are led by Bunjil, the Wedge-tailed Eagle, who created men from bark and women from mud.

It is safe to say that a great night was had by everyone.

Rain! Rain! Rain! Yes, it sure did. Wet weather gear did not stand a chance for the first 100km, making the first two checkpoints in Winton and Lumsden appealing to some. Many not bothered by the conditions kept in character in their fancy dress, with nothing but smiles.
