The 2024 Fall Board Meetings and the 2025 Spring Board Meetings in Baltimore, Maryland; All full board Zoom meetings except one.

All conference calls of the RKI and RKR as requested

2025 Yankee Rally in Bangor, Maine,

### VICE PRESIDENT - NORM BEAUSOLEIL

#### State of the Member-At-Large (M.A.L.) Program

At the time of this report... we have 296 M.A.L.'s Region 1 = 27 Region 2 = 20 Region 3 = 20 Region 4 = 33 Region 5 = 37 Region 6 = 39 Region 7 = 104 Region 8 = 15 Overseas (Mexico) = 1

Through the hard work and perseverance of many Chapter Presidents and their Officers, we have or will be able to plug twenty-three (23) M.A.L. applicants into chapters for chapter member status. Seven (7) MAL applicants were approved and in April/May they recruited one more member and formed a new chapter in Iowa. Finland has grown from 3 MALs to 24 and we are all hoping a Finland chapter will soon be welcomed. And we have 2 pending MALs in Mexico.

#### And now, I'm going to repeat myself, as this is my core belief as your VP

As the MAL Program Manager, I want to reiterate what the MAL Program was originally designed for and what I believe it is supposed to do. The program was designed to give a fledgling Club (1980's) exposure in areas that we hadn't reached "en mass". Many states, provinces and even countries started out with a single MAL here and/or there. Their presence gave the new Club exposure, and soon more firefighters joined those MALs and formed chapters. The Program is a steppingstone TO chapter membership and formation, NOT FROM chapter membership to independent riding.

Today, we are so well represented around the world that I am doing my best to place every MAL applicant in a chapter. A vast majority of those applicants are fully in favor of chapter membership. Now, I need ALL chapter officers to open the door to remote members. Take them under your chapter's watchful eye, expose them to life as chapter members, then let them spread their wings and start a chapter of their own out yonder. A chapter member 100 miles from his chapter should be doing the same thing an MAL is expected to do.

There are many chapters (and their officers) that are unhappy with some (maybe a lot) of their member's attendance records, so they shy away from bringing in new members that will clearly not be attending everything due to the travel time and distance. My position, and that of most officers I speak with, is this: If they weren't in your chapter yesterday, attending meetings, helping at events and joining you for rides, whose loss is it if they aren't there tomorrow? Certainly not the chapter's – you can't lose what you don't have. And, they may be in an area your chapter wouldn't necessarily ride to so, new adventures for you!

## VICE PRESIDENT - NORM BEAUSOLEIL

My vision and plan with the MAL Program is to <u>urge</u> current MALs that move to an area that has a chapter to join that chapter. The benefits for both are overwhelmingly good. If a chapter forms near an MAL, I will <u>urge</u> that MAL to become part of that chapter for the same reasons. Any MAL <u>applicant</u> that is within a reasonable distance of an existing chapter will be referred to that chapter, and I will expect that chapter to welcome the member with an open-door policy.

Finally, for those chapter members that move away from their home chapter area and ask for MAL status, I will **urge** them to remain with their chapter. They are already members. I ask, honestly, as a member of the Red Knights, what benefit is it for YOU to change the bottom rocker?

Lastly, for those chapter members that look to leave a chapter because you (or someone is making you) feel that you are letting them down, falling behind or not carrying your fair share of the load, remember this. In the Red Knights, <u>it should be understood</u> by the members AND chapter and Club leadership <u>that</u> **family, religion, and the ability to provide come before the Club.** Without happy and healthy members, chapters **and** this Club can't survive. This Club was not formed with a "*Club first*" mentality, so, if you EVER experience that within your chapter, I want you to call me right away. We didn't design this Club to require attendance of any kind, and, as a Founder, I pray it never does.

When Dave Hamilton (RIP), Jack Pierce, Ed Wright, Dave Hunt, Colin Mackey (RIP), Roger Wentzell, Jon Tripp, Bob Bourassa, Don Parker, Bob Goulet (RIP) and I closed our meeting in August (and October) of 1982 there were 11 members in 1 chapter, representing 3 towns in 1 state. Today, thanks to all of you believing in our dream, we stand nearly 10,000 strong, representing 27 countries around the world, with more on the horizon.

In closing, I recognize that we all can't, and won't, agree on everything. Each of us see problems, issues and solutions differently. If we all agreed, if we all saw it the same way, life would be boring, wouldn't it! Change can be good, and honestly, I believe very often it is good, but it can't and won't happen if you sit back, complaining loudly to a few but silently to the many. I truly enjoy my role as your vice president, and I look forward to another 2 or more years representing all of you. But I would urge anyone that feels they have something to offer, sees something they believe is being missed or feels there is a need for change to step up and throw your name in the hat. No challenge, no change. Give the membership a voice. Give them a choice!

Remember, we came to ride!



## TREASURER – SCOTT RYAN

Treasurer's Report – Convention 2025

Please accept this, my 2025 convention report for activities in 2024 as International Treasurer.

Since my last convention report, I have attended the fall and spring in-person meetings in Baltimore along with numerous Board Meetings by way of Zoom and the second International Convention outside of North America. This time I went early to experience more of the beauty in Europe making the loop around the Baltic Sea and Gulf of Bothnia and experiencing what Google said was the traditional food of all 13 countries I went through, well worth the time!



We have added 15 chapter in 2024 and did have to officially close 9 at Convention in 2024.

As far as members go there were over 1,125 new members who joined our club in 2024! In my report last year I asked Chapter Presidents to be familiar with the By-Laws as they relate to Social Members, those By-Laws changed at the convention in 2024 and just as importantly there was a change not accepted by the membership. This points to the importance to reading not just what the By-Laws say, but what they also do not say. That is, the By-Laws now say that step- and half- relationships are eligible for Social Membership. Not list in the relationships is in-law relationships, because they are not listed, they are not eligible. This was affirmed at the 2024 convention when a By-Law proposal to explicitly include in-laws was presented to the membership and was voted down. Again, it's important to be familiar with what the By-Laws say and what they do not say, but you aren't in this alone. If you are unsure, check with your Country/Province/State Representative, if they are unsure, they can reach out to their Regional Director.

A quick refresher on Quarterly Roster updates. A big part of this process is to ensure someone in your chapter is checking the official email account. Rosters themselves should be updated with me as soon after they change as possible – changes through the quarter can be sent from personal email accounts if that is easier. The quarterly update should be a simple "no roster update" since I should already have all updates. Heaven 1 protocol will only apply to people on the International Roster.

It has been my pleasure to serve you and I look forward to continuing as your Treasurer.

## **REGION 1 DIRECTOR - KEN MAY**

To My Red Knights Family,

Region 1 consists of the following:

- 8 States
- 98 Chapters
- 2,678 Chapter Members
- 27 Members at Large
- 2,705 Total Members



It has been 12 months since my last Convention Report, and I am sad to say that Region 1 has transferred 16 members to the Heaven One Roster. All I ask is that we keep their memories alive as they now ride in the sky.

Last August we held our International Convention for the 2nd time outside of North America, in Leipzig, Germany. Even though the Board was in meetings for most of the time, we were able to take a day and visit such sites as The Berlin Wall, Check Point Charlie, the famous Brandenburg Gate and of course the Fire Station, where we enjoyed lunch. Thank you, Germany, for a wonderful and unforgettable time.

As Regional Director I hold two In-Person meetings each year with my State Representatives (March - October) in Boylston, Massachusetts. This Year we said farewell to two State Reps, long-time Massachusetts Rep George Colby and Vermont State Rep George Roy. Both men were exceptional at what they did for their states and completed every task they were asked to do. We also welcomed their replacements, Ryan Peebles of VT and Kevin Martin of MA. Our meetings may be long and tiresome, but we get a lot more accomplished as a Region when we work as a team.

The May Day Fund, which has been mentioned several times over the past years, has continued to help Region 1 members in time of need with a small monetary gift. I am proud to say that with the Red Knight Family's help this program is still moving forward, and the committee has just ordered more coins (which are available for purchase.) I would also be amiss if I didn't mention Maine Chapter 10, who has created a Region 1 Road Runner Challenge Ride to help in funding the May Day account.

As Regional Director it is my duty to attend not only the International Board meetings but also State and Chapter meetings when possible. Over this past year, I have attended meetings in New Jersey, New York, Connecticut, New Hampshire and Maine. I can also add the following events. New Jersey Fireman's Parade in Wildwood, Scooter Stampede in Oklahoma, Founding Fathers / International Board Coin Holder Dedication in Boylston, New Jersey's After Christmas Party, New York Chapter 6 Bowling fund raiser in Binghamton NY, Red Knights Steak Night, New Jersey Chapter 13 Barbeque, New York Chapter 25's 20th Anniversary Fundraiser which has raised over \$200,000 over the years. I also plan on attending the New York State Picnic at the Volunteer Fireman's Home (June), New York Chapter 28 Christmas in July Ride (July), just to name a few.

The 2025 Yankee Rally hosted by several Maine Chapters was an absolute success. The event hosted 285 Red Knights that signed in at the event, representing 2 countries (3 because a member who's only chapter is Switzerland 6, even though she is a resident of the USA was present), 12 States, 3 Canadian Provinces, 4 Regions, 61 individual chapters, 2 Founding Fathers (Bob Bourassa & Norm Beausoleil) and Jackie Hamilton (widow of Founding Father Dave Hamilton). The Rally consisted of 4 escorted rides, an Ice Cream Night, Food Truck and games at the local Harley Dealer and several Auction items. But who could forget the Saturday Night Dinner when the choices were 2 whole Lobsters served with Steamers, Mussels and corn on the cob and for those Landlubbers, a New York Strip Steak, cooked to perfection, served with Baked Potato and String Beans.

For those that do not know, the Yankee Rally was not without some heroics.

On Saturday evening, the Red Knights were enjoying the beautiful dinner offsite at a local Elks lodge. Buses were supplied to transport Red Knight members to and from the host and secondary hotels. The return buses started at about 9:30 PM, heading back.

Though the first bus was full, 2 members from New Jersey were on that bus. As they arrived back at the hotel the New Jersey members enjoyed some friendly conversation in the hotel lobby before heading to bed at around 10:00 PM. Both members, already being packed for their trip home on Sunday, laid down to watch a little TV and fell asleep. One member was woken by a loud snort sound, thinking the other snored, got up and went into the bathroom and upon his return, heard a gasp of a last breath.

He immediately checked on his roommate, realizing there was no Pulse or Breathing, pulled him to the floor, called 9-1-1 (10:33 PM) and started CPR.

Within 10 minutes, Bangor Fire, Paramedics and Police arrived on scene, hooking up the AED and shocking him 3 times. They then placed a Lucas Compression machine to his chest and began starting IV solutions.

I was in my room when I received a call that the Police, Fire and Paramedics are at the hotel. Quickly getting dressed and entering the lobby where no one knew who the ambulance was for. Then a New Jersey member exited the elevator and told me it was his roommate.

The Paramedics exited the next elevator; the patient on a stretcher with the Lucas machine attached, Bag Valve Mask to assist in breathing and IV bags hanging. He was transported to Northern Light Eastern Maine Medical Center.

Crissy White, the lead coordinator for the Rally, drove the New Jersey member and me to the hospital where we waited for words on his condition.

The doctor came out to speak with us and to get all the details leading to the incident. Once information was passed on, the doctor left, and we again waited.

The doctor returned several hours later and indicated that he had suffered a major heart attack and Stents were placed in his heart arteries to help with the blood flow. He was also placed on a respirator to help him breathe and it would be about 48 to 72 hours before they would know if he suffered any major damage.

The doctor stated that if he survives, it was because of the quick actions taken at the hotel.

We returned to the hotel at 1:57 AM.

Even though I checked on his condition every day, three days later, I received a message that he (even though still in the hospital) was sitting up in a chair eating a meal.

More good news came on Saturday, June 14th, because of the quick and heroic actions of one Red Knight member, another Red Knight is home in New Jersey with his family.

I am also happy to report that our next several Yankee Rallies have been confirmed as well and we will be heading to the Finger Lakes of New York in 2026, Mystic Connecticut in 2027, Vermont in 2028 and tentatively back to Maine in 2029.

As your Region 1 Director, I must say it is a task that I thoroughly enjoy. I handle 20 – 30 phone calls a week on average, and approximately 10 – 12 hours on Region 1 and International business. As always, my line is open for discussion to any Red Knight seeking assistance.

## **REGION 2 DIRECTOR - RANDY SMITH**

#### **Greetings Brothers and Sisters**

The past year has been one of the most fulfilling periods that I have had in my 4 decades with the Club. The International Board is a group of 12 very committed individuals, each with our own viewpoints and regional insights, but with one goal above all others – making this Club better. We may have spirited discussions over issues, but we never lose sight of the fact that we work for you, the almost 10,000 worldwide members that drive this organization.



Region 2 encompasses eastern Canada, from Ontario to Newfoundland. There are 40 chapters, with 850 chapter members and 19 MALs. Our two most distant chapters are over 3200 km apart. Without events such as the Atlantic Rally, it would be impossible to meet many members of the Region.

Since the 2024 Convention in Leipzig, Germany, I have attended all meetings of the Board either in person or remotely. We continue to deal with issues on an ongoing basis, and also to try to pre-empt issues before they occur.

This year, I am responsible for the Memorial House reservations. Did you know that the Red Knights have a house in Boylston, MA? You can stay there for a minimal fee, see some Red Knights history, have a BBQ on the deck and hang out. The House is available year-round to visiting Red Knights from around the world.

I have attended several Heaven One presentations, in Ontario, Quebec, as well as two in New York State (International Board members will cover each other's services in certain circumstances). Each of these presentations was well received, and until you have felt the appreciation of the fallen Knight's family and chapter members it's hard to understand. It's also a reminder to always submit your quarterly roster updates, to ensure that your members are entitled to not only this honour, but also the free \$4000 Accidental Death benefit offered to North American Knights.

Ontario and Quebec Red Knights participated for the first time ever in the Canadian Fallen Firefighters Memorial weekend last September 6-8. 

Her loyalty, presence, and passion for the ride didn't just speak for themselves- they were seen, respected, and recognized by the brotherhood.

In a group where associate membership isn't given lightly, Amanda stands as a reminder that respect on the road knows no gender. We are proud to shine a spotlight on Amanda- a woman who rides her own, represents MN7 with heart, and proves that the patch is earned.

#### Q: What first drew you to riding motorcycles?

**A:** I've wanted to ride motorcycles since I can remember. My dad was a motorcycle police officer for Richfield PD in the late 60s. My brother was a motorcycle police officer in Bremerton WA his entire career. There is something about it that makes me feel alive when I ride. It's an extension of me.

Q: What does being an Associate Member mean to you, personally and as a woman rider? A: Being voted into a club demonstrates that I have integrity and that I represent what the club represents, which is safety and public service. As a woman rider, being voted into a male dominated club only goes to show I can demonstrate skill and that gender doesn't matter. Skills are skills and character is of utmost importance.

**Q:** Were there any challenges you faced being a woman in this space- and how did you deal with them?

**A:** Being a woman rider, I haven't had to face many challenges. I know what I am capable of and what I'm willing to learn, which is that we never stop learning. I am always observing and developing as a rider. One this I really enjoy is the amount of riders and how everyone rides-there is always something to learn.

**Q:** What advice would you give to other women looking to ride or find their crew? **A:** *My advice: keep riding and seeking the adventure you are after. The right people will come into you life and it will be memorable.*


### **Oklahoma Red Knights State Meeting and State Ride**

### Letter from the Grand Tour Assistant - Europe

As a Red Knight, we can complete five tours and receive a certificate and a rocker for your vest as a reward. Once you have completed all tours, you will receive the Grand Tour Master award and a coin.

GRAND TOUR, FIRE STATION, RED KNIGHT. The 12 stations and the Alphabet Tour.



Since last year, you can qualify for the "Loyal to our Duty" tour after receiving the Grand Tour Master. Participation is free and only members in good standing can take part in the Grand Tour program.

However, there are a few important rules that must be followed or your application will be rejected. The Grand Tour Committee monitors the rules very closely, so we will show you what is important below.

- For a tour, you have 365 days from the start date of the first picture to collect the corresponding letters. (Exception: the alphabet tour possible for several years).
- Only active fire stations that are in operation may be used (IE Xerox, for example, is no longer an active fire station).
- A picture may only be used once, if necessary, go there again on a different date/day.
- At each fire station, you must take a picture of yourself with your vest and your own motorcycle. (The complete motorcycle, not just parts of it).

#### **Grand Tour Registration / Application**

- The Grand Tour online form on the International Homepage must be completed.
- If you are doing a tour as a group, you only need to fill in 1 registration form with all the names of the participating members (separate names with a comma).
- After completing the form, press the "Send" button
- A return address is required to which the certificates and patches can be sent. The photos must then be sent separately to the Grand Tour Chairman grandtour@redknightsmc.com (Total Max 25MB data size).

Such was the impact of the demonstration, many of the attendees ordered airbag vests on the night. And to further cement their relationship with the Blue Knights, England 2's President and Vice-President helped South Yorkshire Police and Blue Knights England 9 marshal 1000 motorcycles in the Sheffield Children's Hospital annual Egg Run on Easter Sunday.

This immersive experience allowed participants to become familiar with the use of fire extinguishers in a simulated environment, offering a fun and interactive approach to this essential tool in the event of a fire. training, by simulating emergency situations where every gesture counts.

#### Learning to Pick Up a Motorcycle After a Fall

providing greater safety for motorcyclists. The scheme generated great interest among participants, who welcomed the importance of immediate access to this crucial information.

The FRANCE IX Chapter's commitment to the show was widely praised, not only for its expertise in road safety, but also for its involvement in a just and essential cause. By combining a passion for motorcycling, safety training and support for research against multiple sclerosis, the Chapter has been able to transform a moment of conviviality into a real learning and solidarity experience.

Thus, this two-wheeler show in Vannes was not only a showcase for the novelties of the motorcycle world, but a strong moment of exchange, learning and support for those who need it most. Freiburg im Breisgau - On Sunday,

30.03.2025, the season opening of the South Chapter Opening D-A-CH took place in Freiburg im Breisgau. This was carried out by Germany XI in the equipment shed of the volunteer fire brigade Oberstadt-Wiehre.

When, in the best weather and convivial camaraderie, a member's mobile phone suddenly raised an alarm, the situation changed abruptly. The emergency rescue app "Region der Lebensretter 3.0" alerted the



members to a person in the next street with cardiac arrest in parallel with the local EMS.

The purpose of this emergency rescue app is to alert registered emergency responders working in a Rescue or Fire Emergency organization near the occurring cardiac arrest/medical emergency to keep the therapy-free time until the arrival of the emergency services as small as possible.

We did not hesitate for long and went to the location displayed in the app as quickly as possible. When we arrived on site, passers-by had already begun resuscitation. We then took over the revival and initial care with a total of 5 comrades and thus ensured a permanent and smooth preservation of the cardiovascular system.

After a few minutes, the parallel alarmed EMS arrived. We also supported the rescue service until the patient was transported to the nearest hospital and then took care of the people involved.

Since its founding 15 years ago, Chapter Switzerland 1 has been collecting and donating for the department for children with burn injuries.


They are delighted that they now have the most modern children's hospital in Switzerland that also has a research and training centre is in the building next door


