
## PRESIDENT – SPIKE OSTIGUY

### State of the Member-At-Large (M.A.L.) Program

12-31-25... we have 316 R.K.M.C., Member-At-Large Members:

Active = 260  
Social = 49  
Junior - 7

In 2025 we received 124 R.K.M.C., Member-At-Large applications and I've worked on additional ones from previous years, approving 9 of those past year applicants, 3 sent to chapters and the others as MALs. 58 have been approved as MAL, 45 have been referred to chapters, 8 requested transfer from chapters to MAL (6 approved, 1 denied and 1 pending), and 6 were denied membership, the rest are still pending. We also had 12 Members-at-Large resign from the Club. There are 21 MALs that have not paid dues since 2024 and they will be dropped from the roster on February 1. Pending MALs, applicants that have not followed through, from 2024 and earlier may also be removed from the pending folder and will be required to re-apply if they show renewed interest.

### In accordance with the By-Laws Article 2, Section 2:10 3. International Dues:

It is unfortunate I report that there are 49 Member-At-Large Members on restricted service. 21 have not paid since 2024, are now 2 years in arrears, and in jeopardy of being removed, and 28 have not renewed for 2026 and are now 1 year in arrears. All have been advised that they are now on restricted service.

We do hope that you take this opportunity to renew your membership and return to “in good standing” status. **If you are an MAL and have not received a “Dues Reminder” e-mail** from me, please send an e-mail to [vicepresident@redknightsmc.com](mailto:vicepresident@redknightsmc.com). The most likely cause is an incorrectly recorded or copied email address on the roster – mistakes happen.

I have also found that there are some e-mail accounts whose servers consistently reject our “@redknightsmc.com” domain emails. To date, I have identified accounts from “icloud.com”, “t-online.de” and “Mac.com” consistently reject our emails. If you’ve not heard from the Red Knights in the past 6 months or so, and you use one of these email providers, please try to provide an alternate email so we may keep you informed. If you’ve not heard from us and you don’t use one of these servers, contact your chapter president or area Rep to verify we have your email address correctly entered in the roster.

### Member-at-Large Program Update

As manager of the Member-at-Large Program (the Program) I have a great deal of freedom with the process, and I would like to remind you all of my thoughts, particularly chapter leadership and those members that move away from your “home” chapter.

The Red Knights is an organization based on **Chapter Membership**, and the Program was designed to allow the Club to gain exposure in areas where we are not established. It is designed to be a starting point to eventual chapter membership, it was not designed to be an endpoint membership location for chapter members to transfer to. For example, a motorcycling firefighter in Colorado, Saskatchewan or Latvia hears about us and asks to join. Voila, a perfect MAL candidate. We have no chapter in the state, province or country yet, so the MAL program can do just what it was designed to do – RKMC exposure in a remote area. New member, new place, no question.

Where I am taking a different approach is this: **First**, I am asking current chapter members that move to **seriously consider** several things before I approve a transfer to MAL.

Let’s say a member from MA 1 moves to Colorado. That member is already a Red Knight, and, although the By-Laws (Section 2:06(2)) allow a transfer to MAL due to a “travel hardship” – and I won’t necessarily deny the request – **I will first ask 3 very serious questions.**

1. Why do you want to leave your chapter?
2. Why do you want to be an MAL? Based on your answers to 1 and 2, I will ask
3. Why should (or would) I approve your request to become an MAL? Remember, we are a **Chapter Based** organization, and a chapter member is able to represent us in a new area, and with their access to information from their (current) chapter, i.e. newsletters, e-mails, contacts, etc., they can do the same job as an MAL, including starting a new chapter, with the benefit of current chapter support.

You might say that that member won't be an active member of the chapter – he/she won't make meetings, rides, events, parties, etc. I SAY, SO WHAT? I'll bet every chapter already has local members that fit that description. Having that member move away won't affect chapter activities, will it? And, this Club does not approve or condone attendance requirements EXCEPT at the International Board level. Finally, the member that has moved will benefit more from being included in all communications from their chapter. Who loses? I don't see anyone suffering from that scenario.

**Second**, I'll now reverse the roles a bit. Let's say I receive an MAL application from a prospective member who lives in Florida, 100 miles from any other chapter. I have been referring those applicants to ALL chapters in the state, listing closest first, and **asking the chapter presidents**, along with the respective state/province/country reps and the regional directors, **to ALL reach out to the applicant and invite that applicant to join their chapter**, for EXACTLY the same reasons as above. I can only see good things coming to a chapter that can get additional members and a remote member that isn't "active" will still be in the loop and may surprise you, where an MAL may not even know your chapter exists. Once again, who loses? **This one is a win-win**. Once again, I won't necessarily deny the application, but if someone wants to be a member, and chapter membership is available and, on the table, why should that applicant refuse?

**This is where I need your help** – yes, every one of you that is already a member of the RKMC. Welcome and/or invite new members and be open to receiving new members, no matter how far away they live, into your chapters. If they are active look at the benefits. If they are inactive, what have they changed? New blood can infuse new life.

**Heaven One and our Accidental Life benefit** – as you all are aware, transfer to Heaven One is an honor none of us wish upon each other, but it is the final and highly respected benefit to those members who pass while in "Good Standing". The normal process to receive these benefits generally involves the on-line notification form found on our website. What's come to my attention (in some ways painfully) is that these forms are almost always filled out by a chapter officer. Sadly, our Members-at-Large do not have a chapter officer, and very often may be far from any other RKIFMC member, leaving the board uninformed. It has been my practice to notify every representative and Director of new MALs when they are approved. I ask that every representative and director add all MALs in their respective area (state, province, country) to their e-mail distribution list, and that every chapter add all MALs within 100 miles of them to their e-mail distribution list, and treat them like long-lost chapter members. This may help us learn of the loss of an MAL that may otherwise go unnoticed. For the **MALs** – remember, you are entitled to all the benefits a chapter member is. Be sure to have your family notify us through the website or a local chapter should you pass and earn your place in Heaven One.

In closing, I was looking forward to **2026 AND BEYOND** in serving you, the members, to the best of my ability. Unfortunately, in December of 2024, I suffered what appeared to have been a TIA (mini stroke), apparently caused by what was initially diagnosed as CHF. After 6 months of doctors, exams, tests, procedures, and a multitude of prescription medications, the diagnosis was finally and accurately assessed as A-Fib. Following an ablation procedure, the A-Fib now appears to be under control and I am slowly weaning off the last 3 medications. In March, I witnessed the passing of my oldest sister. Additional medical procedures towards the end of this year made 2025 a year of reflection on life, love and those nearest and dearest to me.

I will not be running for re-election in 2026. If you want to run and make a difference, I ask that you look for a nomination, if eligible. If you are asked or desire to make a nomination, look hard at the potential nominee and be sure to understand their intent. Be wise in your choices, and feel free to reach out to me for any enlightenment. Know your candidates before you vote, and vote wisely. Things aren't always as they seem, and there is certainly a lot of mis-information that gets spread by the un-informed.

Thank you for trusting me for the past 2-1/2 years, and, to my wife Kathy, thanks for putting up with me and being the best travel partner a guy could ask for! I hope to see you on the road, or at any of the many upcoming Red Knights events, rides and rallies in 2026, particularly the Yankee in New York and the International Convention in Australia.

I want to thank everyone again for the continued opportunity to be part of the Board! It's such an honor and privilege, and I'm excited to contribute to our Club's future together. As a member of the International Board, I've had the chance to learn a great deal about the dynamics of this organization. There have been joyful moments, as well as some challenging times. I've realized that we don't always have all the facts in any situation, and it's important to communicate with one another. Most of the time, we find that what we think we know is just a story or a misunderstanding. After all, we are all human!



During my last year as your International Secretary, I have had the privilege of attending several important events, including the 2025 International Spring Board Meeting, the 2025 Dixie Rally, the 2025 International Convention, the 2025 International Fall Board Meeting, and, sadly, a few Heaven One services. I cherish the experiences and memories created at each of these events. I look forward to many more years of building bonds, friendships, and unforgettable memories!

Over the past year, I have been busy finishing the transformation of the TMLA (Trademark License Agreement) system into a fully digital platform, and I am pleased to report that it is complete as much as a dynamic system can be. We created a QRG that helps define the system, and you all should have received that from your Regional Directors. It's a step in the right direction for knowledge and transparency.

Please remember that our TMLA system is designed to protect our names and logo from misrepresentation and is not intended to create difficulties or internal strife among our members. One aspect that seems to be commonly misunderstood is the use of the ® symbol. Our intellectual property attorney has clarified its usage: the ® symbol is not compulsory in any jurisdiction where we hold registrations, but it is highly recommended. When I mention this, members often ask what it means. To clarify, the ® is not required, but its use is strongly encouraged, and I will always ask that it be placed on our products. If the symbol is not included, it does not make the item illegal, and I will not disapprove an item solely for the absence of the ®. In fact, placing the ® on an item without proper approval through the TMLA system can create unnecessary issues. Please remember that the names and logo are owned by the International, not a specific Chapter.

If you are unsure whether an item requires a TMLA, please fill out an application along with a picture and send it to me. If the item involves any of our protected names or logos, the answer will always be yes. I'm here to assist you and am always happy to help.

This year, we have had the opportunity to bring the ASSIGN operational management system into our organization. Currently, we are rolling it out Region by Region starting from Regions 8 and 7 and working our way down the list. Regions 6 and 5 are slated to be onboarded around February 1<sup>st</sup>, with the other regions following. The ASSIGN app will place all of the RKMC information into the palm of your hand for easy access. You can view your Chapters TMLAs that are on file, the International documents such as the By-law, and, in the near future, submit different items such as TMLAs, rosters, etc. We are currently seeking individuals who are tech-savvy to be part of the IT Committee to support the ASSIGN system, if you are interested, please reach out to our IT Chair or any member of the International Board. Also, I'd like to put this out there: our International website will always be available. The ASSIGN system is an additional tool to help Chapter Officers and our members get information instantly on their phones, tablets, or PCs.



To My Red Knight Family,

Wow, the 2025 year is in the past already as we look forward to all new adventures in 2026. Region 1 has slightly gone down in numbers, with the loss of 3 chapters, and the adding of 13 members to our Heaven One Roster.

Region 1 now consists of the following:

- 8 States
- 95 Chapters
- 2,657 Chapter Members
- 29 Members at Large
- 2,686 Total Members

As Regional Director it is one of my duties to attend meetings, not only with the International, but with the Region 1 State Reps, State Meetings and when possible, the Chapters. So, this past year I attended all 3 In-Person International Board Meetings along with all the Zoom Meetings that were held. I also attended 2 In-Person State Rep meetings in Boylston along with State and/or Chapter meetings in Maine, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Connecticut and Vermont bringing back to the Region One membership information as to what is happening not only Internationally, but locally throughout the Region. I am sad to say that I personally attended 7 funerals where I presented Memorial Flag and Angel Coin to their families.

With all the meetings, funerals and supporting State and Chapter events, I have traveled over 15,000 miles in my car along with around 5,300 miles on the bike. With these travels, we are sometimes entitled to mileage reimbursement (especially for funerals.) With this I have made several donations toward the principal mortgage on Memorial Hall totaling this year just over \$1,200. The majority of these donations were made honoring the name of the deceased member whose funeral I attended.

Here in Region 1, we have had two changes in our State Representatives as we welcome Blue Kelloway from New Hampshire and Brian White from the great state of Maine. But in welcoming these individuals we needed to say goodbye to others that served. Especially Colin Nelson of NH, as he represented the state long before I served as Regional Director. I need to thank all my Representative for the job, time and effort they put in working to make this organization the best they can. So, Thank You also goes to Chris Rogers (NJ), Tim Tordoff (NY), Ryan Peebles (VT), Tom Gill (CT), Kevin Martin (MA) and Rick Waterman (RI).

As most of you all know by now Region 1 has what we call a “Mayday Fund” which is used to help any Region 1 member with a small monetary donation in their time of need. Well, this fund is still actively moving forward as we have sold out of our original 1000 commemorative coins and recently purchased 200 more.

2025 saw an increase in the number of Chapters completing Tours.


544 Tours were completed by 93 Chapters in 2025. 533 by active members and 11 by Guest. 181 members were First timers.



### ASSIGN Operations Comes to Red Knights MC

Structured Operations, Shared Awareness, Stronger Coordination  
By: Rasmus “Wild Patch” Lillemose, Denmark 2

Red Knights MC is taking an important step toward more structured and transparent operational coordination. ASSIGN Operations is now being introduced across the organization, already rolled out within Region 8 and Region 7, with 2275 members - followed by Region 6 and Region 5 in February 2026, and thereafter approximately one region per month until all regions are onboard.

This rollout is not about changing who we are, it is about strengthening how we coordinate, communicate, and operate when we ride, plan, escort, or support others. ASSIGN Operations is already widely used by emergency services and operational organizations. Now, it is being adapted to support the way Red Knights MC works in practice.

### What Is ASSIGN Operations?

ASSIGN Operations is an operational management system designed to handle daily operations, coordinated activities, and complex events involving multiple units, people, and resources. The system structures operational work around core elements such as personnel, units, tasks, locations, and timelines, creating a shared operational overview in real time.

Rather than relying on fragmented communication channels, personal notes, or informal coordination, ASSIGN Operations provides a single operational platform where information is structured, updated, and accessible to those who need it.

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## IT COMMITTEE CHAIR – DON BRANDT

### Proven Use in Emergency and Operational Organizations

ASSIGN Operations is used extensively by emergency services and preparedness organizations to manage daily readiness and active operations. In these environments, the system supports:

- Allocation and tracking of units and personnel
- Resource and vehicle overview
- Operational documentation and traceability
- Shared situational awareness across command levels

A key technical principle is role-based visibility. Users only see information relevant to their role, ensuring clarity even in complex operations. This reduces cognitive load and allows users to focus on execution rather than information management.

Another core strength is transparency. Changes in status, task completion, and resource availability are visible in real time, creating a common operational picture and supporting informed decision-making.

### Structured Operations Without Losing Flexibility

ASSIGN Operations does not enforce rigid workflows. Instead, it provides a structured framework that supports both planned activities and dynamic situations. Tasks and roles can be predefined, adjusted, and reassigned as conditions change—without losing overview or control.

Documentation is handled as part of normal operations. Actions and decisions are logged automatically, reducing administrative effort and ensuring accurate records without extra work for the user.

### How Red Knights MC Benefits from ASSIGN Operations

For Red Knights MC, ASSIGN Operations supports activities such as escorts, events, coordinated rides, charitable missions, and support operations, especially when these involve multiple chapters or regions.

Operations can be planned with:

- Clearly defined roles and responsibilities
- Task distribution across members and units
- Route and timing coordination
- Real-time status updates during execution

Leadership gains a clear overview of participation, progress, and potential issues, while individual members receive clear instructions relevant to their role.

When cooperating with emergency services or public authorities, ASSIGN Operations provides a professional and familiar operational structure. This improves coordination, safety, and mutual understanding, as the system aligns closely with how emergency services already operate.

### A Gradual and Controlled Rollout

The phased rollout ensures that each region has time to become familiar with the system before the next joins. Starting with Regions 8 and 7, followed by Regions 6 and 5 in February, ASSIGN Operations will be introduced steadily across all regions.

This approach allows training, feedback, and adaptation to happen organically, ensuring the system supports Red Knights MC in practice, not just in theory.

### Looking Ahead

ASSIGN Operations is a tool that turns coordination into structure and complexity into clarity. For Red Knights MC, it strengthens operational capability without changing the spirit of the organization. Members remain volunteers, rides remain rides, but coordination becomes clearer, safer, and more transparent.

As more regions come online, ASSIGN Operations will become a shared operational foundation across Red Knights MC, supporting both independence at chapter level and strong coordination at regional and national scale.

First Happy New Years to all. It is between Christmas and New Years that I am drafting this report in hopes of bringing everyone up to date on what the committee has been doing this past year. The committee currently has four members: me (Massachusetts 4), Thomas Delboi (Switzerland 4), Dave Emery (Vermont 2), and recently appointed Hardy Clemens (Australia 22). We did not have any contested races for the positions up for election or Special Elections (to fill a vacancy) in 2025. We did respond to requests for information and processed incumbent officers running for re-election to ensure continued compliance and eligibility. There was one open position for Regional Director in Region 5, which was filled without a challenge.

In addition to the above activities the committee provided updated election materials as well as Candidate (Nominee) profiles for posting on the international website. I represented the committee at the Annual Business Meeting held at the 2025 Convention and the 2025 Fall International Board of Directors Meeting (via Zoom). The committee held a formal meeting on October 9<sup>th</sup> to establish proposed goals and objectives for the 2026 election cycle. Minutes of the meeting were provided to the International Board of Directors for review. There were several ad hoc meetings, and informal exchanges/communications throughout the year.

One of the objectives approved by the International Board of Directors was to modernize the Nominee Profile to be available for the January 1<sup>st</sup> start of the 2026 election cycle. This was accomplished ahead of schedule and has been available as a downloadable file on the International webpage since late November. The Board also supported the request to add a member to expand geographic representation of the committee. The committee has also been engaged in the process of reviewing consistency of various sections of documents governing the activities of the committee and the overall election process.

I would like to conclude with a thank you to the committee members and for the support and guidance of the International Board of Directors.

## NOMINATING COMMITTEE CHAIR – THOMAS L. CAISSE

### Participating in the International Election Process

The election process is defined by three groups of stake holders having distinct responsibilities. The first are those who wish to be placed on the ballot as a candidate. The second are those who provide the nominations for the potential candidate for a specific position, and the third are the Chapters and Members-at-Large (MAL's) who cast the actual votes to elect the candidate. The common thread through all three groups is the requirement to be in Good Standing to participate in the process and understand the election timeline as published annually on the International website.

For those interested in seeking a position on the International Board of Directors (IBOD), it is suggested that they be intimately familiar with International By-Law section **ARTICLE III: INTERNATIONAL GOVERNMENT** to understand the roles and responsibilities of the position they are seeking and the potential time commitment. It is also suggested that they review International By-Law **Section 3:02 Qualification and Election** to ensure that they meet all of the qualifications to be nominated. A point frequently overlooked in **Section 3:02** is that it's more stringent than any of the other qualification's in that not only must the nominee be an "Active Member" and have served in specific officer roles in their Chapter or Association, but they must also be or have been assigned to firefighting duties. A crucial step is submitting the Nominee Profile to the Nominating Committee and obtaining the required nominations. The Nominating Committee review process starts once the completed Nominee Profile document, and 2 qualifying nominations have been received by the committee.

The expectation for those submitting a nomination is that as the President or Vice President of their Chapter they are nominating an individual at the will of that Chapter. Those submitting a nomination should be familiar with the requirements for nomination, confirm that the individual being nominated meets qualification requirements, and verify that the individual is interested in being placed on the ballot for that position. The first two nominations found to meet requirements will be the official nominations and will appear in the Nominee Profile for that candidate on the International webpage.

Once nominations have been closed, the International Treasurer provides the Nominating Committee with an authoritative list of Chapters and MAL's that are eligible to vote in the upcoming election. In order to be eligible Chapters and MAL's must be in Good Standing at the time that Nominations are closed in order to initiate the process with the third-party vendor administering the electronic voting. Eligible Chapters will receive their ballot from the third-party vendor via their official Red Knights email address. Eligible MAL's will receive their ballot from the third-party vendor via the most recent email address on file. Voting instructions are provided in the cover email and ballot document.

Special elections to fill midterm vacancies follow a similar process flow as above but on a compressed timeline.


#### NY-26 Hosts its annual Teddy Bear Run

#### Germany Veterans Honor Ride





#### Tarrawingee Fire Memorial Ride

Saturday December 20 Red Knights Aus14 made the ride up to Tarrawingee, a small village located on the Great Alpine Road just outside of Wangaratta. I'll give a brief overview.

On 22 December 1943 a grass fire that began near the Bowser railway yard (north of Wangaratta) spread rapidly towards Tarrawingee during an extreme drought and wartime manpower shortages.

Volunteers and local farm workers rushed to fight the blaze, but a sudden change of wind overran a group of firefighters; 10 men died (including two 14-year-old schoolboys), making it one of Victoria's worst firefighter losses at the time.

The tragedy highlighted gaps in firefighting resources during WWII and helped drive later improvements in equipment, organisation and memorialisation by the CFA and local communities.

The site is remembered each year and a memorial commemorates the ten who died.

Great turn out for this ride, awesome to see some faces again and say giddyay.




